

Ponte Vedra High School is a public, community high school that draws from the greater Ponte Vedra Beach area in the northeast corner of St. Johns County, Florida. For each of the past nine years, St. Johns County School District has been ranked first in the state out of 67 districts by the Florida Department of Education, and was granted AdvancEd accreditation in April 2013. Ponte Vedra High School is ranked first among the seven high schools in St. Johns County. 90% of the Class of 2018 graduates moved on to a 2 or 4-year college.

Academies at Ponte Vedra High School

Three academies are available to in-zone and out-of-zone St. Johns County resident students based on an open access lottery acceptance with annual requirements upon admission. Academy students take their core course requirements with all other students while also satisfying requirements within their chosen academy of interest.

- <u>The Academy of Biotechnology and Medical Research:</u> This program is a STEM academy that is focused on the use of living organisms to solve problems or make useful products from biological systems. The academy is run in conjunction with scientists from the Mayo Clinic, Johnson and Johnson, and Nemours Children's Health System to educate students in the field of biotechnology through inquiry-based methods of instruction and advanced curriculum while addressing social and ethical issues in one of Florida's premier growth industries.
- The Academy of Information Technology (sponsored by Citi): This program was piloted in 2015 and officially offered in 2016 for students to further their education and careers in all aspects of information technology. Content includes, but is not limited to, computer application skills, computer hardware, software applications, web applications, web page design, systems support and network concepts. Students also receive relevant industry certifications to prepare them for careers in high-demand technical fields.
- The Academy of International Business and Marketing: This program offers students exciting, hands-on training in an Integrated academic and business curriculum that prepares them for future studies in international business or international marketing. Students must select one of two "strands" when applying for this academy. The business strand provides hands-on training with opportunities for students to receive industry certifications and dual enrollment credits while taking Microsoft Office computer applications to a higher level. Students integrate software with real-life business simulations in our global economy. The marketing strand includes coursework in the principles and foundations of marketing management and in the marketing functions of manufacturers, wholesalers, and retailers. In 2012, this academy achieved Model status, the highest conferred by the National Career Academy Coalition.




- ⇒ Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment courses are weighted an additional 1.0 point.
