Student Access

Students have had access to schoology from the beginning of the year. They use the procedures to the right to access schoology. Students use a secure schoology website specific to our district for additional security. This is a DIFFERENT website than parents use to view their student's schoology page. - Sign in as follows:
 - <u>First login:</u> login using your
 - student number as follows:

 - No PASSWORD (keep the password blank) on the first page
 - <u>Second login:</u> use your computer credentials as follows: s###### and the password that your homeroom teacher gave you for computer access.

Social networking sites are sites such as Facebook, Snap chat, Instagram. The risks associated with social sites could include cyber bullying, giving out personal information and receiving viruses from someone that you don't know. These risks could be eliminated by setting your account to privacy, telling someone if are currently being cyber bullied and you could also delete any messages that you get from someone that you don't know. If you follow these safety rules then you will be better of with a social networking site. These rules would help you from receiving any harmful malware if it was sent, from being repeatedly cyber bullied, or from giving out info.

Cyber bullying is where someone repeatedly bullies someone else online, the bully is known as the perpetrator and the one bullied is the victim. If someone happens to be cyber bullied they often keep it to themselves and end up being brought down. The victim can feel depressed, scared from receiving a threat, and this sometimes results in suicide. However the perpetrator may think that they are only playing around they can also receive consequences for their actions. If someone were to cyberbully then they could be suspended from school or taken to jail, not to mention their parents would probably be very disappointed. As you can see it is best if you don't cyberbully at all because it can have negative effects on both sides.

Schoology Help

- Parent Help Guide
- How to Link to Your Child's Account
- How to Setup Your Account Notifications

- Q: Do parents have to set up their own accounts?
- A: Yes, parents/guardians need to register for their own accounts in Schoology. When parents register to create their own accounts in Schoology, part of the registration process is to enter in your child's access code. Schoology uses this access code to associate your parent account with St. Johns County School's Schoology portal and to link your new parent account with your child.

- Q: How do I register for a parent account?
- A: Use the following steps to register for your parent account:
- In your browser, navigate to <u>www.schoology.com</u>.
- In the top right corner of the screen, click the Sign Up button.
- Select Parent from the options
- Enter the Access Code for your child that was sent home from their school.
- Fill out the information for your new Schoology account (your email address and the password you want to use for your Schoology account) and click "**Register**."

- Q: When going through the registration process, do I enter my child's name in the box?
- A: No, when registering for your parent Schoology account, you enter in *your* information in the box, not your child's. Your child already has a Schoology account.
- Q: Do I need to set up an account for my child?
- A: No. All active SJCSD students automatically have a Schoology account. They can log in at <u>https://stjohnsschools.schoology.com</u> using their school account and password.

• Q: How do I get my child's access code?

- A: Parent letters with your child's access code will be sent home from each school. If you did not receive a letter or have lost the code, please contact your child's teacher.
- Q: Do I create a parent account for each of my children?
- A: No, if you have multiple children, you create a single parent account with 1 child's code. After you have created your account, you can link the rest of your children to your account within Schoology by clicking on the arrow in the top left corner by your name and selecting +Add Child. Enter in another child's code in the box, click "USE CODE" and they will now be linked to your account. You can link each child in your family to your account in this manner.
