Performance Goal #1 Improve academic achievement for all students

Benchmarks:

- All schools that are graded will receive an "A"
- 75% of students will be proficient or above on Reading SSS
- 75% of students will be proficient or above on Math SSS
- 80% of students will be proficient or above on Writing SSS
- 50% of students will be proficient or above on Science SSS
- 35% of students in grades 11 and 12 will be enrolled in dual enrollment or advanced placement courses
- 50% of high school students will complete 3 classes in a vocational program

Key Strategies:

- Coordinate articulation among all schools focusing on the district mission
- Provide strong instructional leadership
- Strengthen foundation skills PK-Grade 3
- Develop and implement a district-wide PK-Grade 12 sequential, rigorous curriculum
- Increase academic learner engagement and effective differentiated instruction for all students
- Promote a positive school climate with high expectations for student success
- Expand opportunities for middle school students by utilizing the Tech Center as a model to transition into technical skills programs
- Utilize problem solving/ RtI model strategies for instruction
- Improve and increase access to technology for learning
- Focus learning on the Next Generation SSS
- Improve college and career readiness opportunities
- Promote vocational/certificate programs
- Align workforce education with skill requirements for the new economy
- Increase participation in district pre-kindergarten programs for early childhood development

Performance Goal #2 Ensure safe and healthy schools.

Benchmarks:

- 100% of school buses will have cameras installed
- 100% of students will meet State immunization guidelines
- Suspensions and expulsions will be reduced by 5% annually
- Worker's Compensation claims will be reduced by 10% annually
- All schools will have operational security cameras

Key strategies:

- Implement consistent school-wide behavior program with high expectations for student behavior
- Screen all staff and volunteers that have direct student contact in accordance with School Board Policy
- Enforce district policies to prevent bullying and harassment
- Implement the district's Character Education program at each school
- Develop a Growth Management Plan that promotes safe environments and optimum utilization of facilities to reach educational goals
- Provide safe and efficient transportation to all qualifying students in the district
- Maintain all school facilities to promote safety and health standards
- Maintain and upgrade emergency and school safety plans
- Collaborate with district health, emergency, and law enforcement agencies to ensure protection for students, staff, and community members
- Provide additional guidance counselors to support positive behavior guidelines
- Implement the Five Year Work Plan for special maintenance and safety upgrades
- Implement the Alternative Education Program with increased technology and additional guidance support


Performance Goal #3 Increase daily attendance and graduation rates

Benchmarks:

- Increase graduation rate by 5% annually
- Decrease the loss of secondary student class cohort numbers by 5%
- Increase the number of secondary students participating in extracurricular activities by 5% annually
- Increase average daily attendance to 98% at each school
- Implement at least three (3) secondary academies for instruction

Key Strategies:

- Increase academic learner engagement for all students
- Increase access to technology for student learning
- Coordinate attendance reporting with effective follow-up for absences
- Provide learning and credit opportunities in the summer for secondary students
- Promote extracurricular activities with secondary students
- Organize community and mentoring support for ninth graders
- Increase guidance counselor support for secondary students
- Recognize and celebrate successful achievements of students and staff
- Promote shared belief and high expectations that all students can learn
- Monitor student progress frequently and effectively by utilizing the problemsolving model (Response to Intervention – RtI)
- Support learning as the most important priority of the school district and community
- Increase graduation rate with "college ready" students who enroll in postsecondary programs
- Structure vocational programs using the "academy" model for instruction



Performance Goal #4 Attract and retain high quality teachers and staff.

Benchmarks:

- 100% of teaches will be highly qualified (NCLB)
- 100% of paraprofessionals will be highly qualified (NCLB)
- Increase the annual average hours of participation in professional development activities for all staff by 5%
- 100% of professional development activities will follow the standards of Florida's protocol for professional development

Key Strategies:

- Promote, reference, and plan focusing on the district's mission and belief statement
- Provide quality professional development for instructional and non-instructional employees
- Employ highly qualified faculty and staff
- Emphasize professional development to promote quality instruction
- Improve and increase access to technology for instruction
- Improve access and training with technology
- Provide sufficient staff to adhere to class size reduction amendment guidelines
- Recruit and retain staff to more closely represent the diversity of the school population
- Provide peer mentoring to support new teachers and staff
- Provide effective classroom management training to support student behavior program
- Provide leadership training for prospective and experienced administrators
- Provide professional development for newly hired teachers and staff
- Participate in statewide teacher recruitment events
- Participate with regional educational leaders to promote research-based professional development for teachers and staff
- Provide training for teachers and administrators in the research-based standards of Florida's protocol for professional development
- Implement an effective district-wide performance appraisal system

Performance Goal #5 Improve parental and community involvement

Benchmarks:

- Increase the number of volunteer hours in schools by 5% annually
- Increase the number of outreach community district presentations by 10% annually
- Increase the number of district parent opportunities to promote student learning by 10% annually

Key Strategies:

- Promote learning as the most important priority of the school district and community
- Communicate with parents through School Advisory Council (SAC) meetings to strengthen school improvement
- Provide open communication with parents with opportunities for workshops, conferences, and additional resources through newsletters
- Provide opportunities for parents and community to have input for school goals, projects, budgets, and policies
- Promote school goals and programs to local community groups
- Participate with local agencies and churches to promote educational goals
- Invite parents regularly to participate in school activities and events
- Increase the number of parent volunteers and student mentors
- Utilize retired teachers to tutor students needing skill development to attain proficiency
- Recognize and celebrate parent success milestones for student achievement
- Upgrade the district and school websites to improve communication

Increase the number of outreach community district presentations by 10% annually

- 2009/2010 a total of 5 presentations were made in the community
 - (Kiwanis, State of Schools Town Hall Meetings, iCare, United Way)
- As of 12/14/2010 a total of 14 presentations have been made (an increase of 280%)

Performance Goal #6 Reduce District dropout rate


Benchmarks:

- Promote district mission and vision with a focus on student achievement
- Provide instruction with student engaged learning
- Increase access to technology for learning
- Decrease number of suspensions and expulsions
- Support all resources needed for an effective Alternative Education Program
- Increase the number of guidance counselors at the secondary schools
- Collaborate with community groups and target strategies to reduce dropout rate
- Recruit mentors to support at-risk students
- Monitor average daily attendance for at-risk students
