Testing Schedule for Virtual Students

Seminole County Public Schools (SCPS) has designated a specific assessment window and testing sites for Seminole County Virtual School students. Testing sessions are limited to virtual students only and capacity is limited. Virtual students not participating in these assessment sessions will be scheduled to test in May with remote learners at their zoned school. Per the Florida Department of Education (FDOE), no remote administrations are available for any statewide summative assessments.

It is recommended that students complete at least 80% of segment 2 in an EOC-tested course prior to sitting for the exam. This ensures that the student has sufficiently covered much of the content covered on the assessment.

- Science Grade 8 is two test sessions on one day.
- Reading Grades 6-8 are two test sessions given over the course of two days.
- Math Grades 6-8 are three test sessions given over the course of two days. The Florida Department of Education does not allow an option to take all three test sessions on one day.
- Algebra 1 and Geometry EOCs are two test sessions given over the course of two days.
- To minimize the number of times students are coming to campus, students have a one-day testing option for the Algebra 1 and Geometry EOCs on April 30.

Student Time on Campus

All testing sessions will take place at the beginning of the school day. Students will arrive at the testing location after all face-to-face students are in their classrooms. Specific arrival and dismissal times will be determined based upon your student's testing location and the length of the subject area assessment.

Health and Safety

It is our priority to provide a safe and healthy environment for your student. Seminole County Public Schools follow all policies regarding the health and safety of your student which includes mandatory face coverings. Students will be required to keep face coverings in place during testing. The application for an accommodation for a face covering in the school setting may be made in collaboration with the school board nurse and school 504 or IEP team. If a parent/guardian is seeking a face covering accommodation or an exemption due to an existing health condition or disability, the team is to make all reasonable accommodations prior to an exemption being granted.
