So here we are – heading into our 26th season in much the same way that we ended our 25th – that is, in uncertain times. We move forward in faith, hopeful that we will see your smiling face, or perhaps your smiling eyes, when you join us for live performances.

Your presence is important to us. The soul of our work in the arts is rooted in interaction with the public. Dance, Music and Theatre depend upon live audiences visual arts, film and culinary delights are created for consumers. Yet, for several months, the world has been deprived of these shared experiences. We have become faces of quarantine, faces of social distancing, faces behind masks, and faces of disappointment. How do we move forward..?

The answer, for us at least, is cautiously. One step at a time. Because our students want a sense of normalcy, and because we believe they deserve as much, we have planned and are pursuing a full season of events as we have done every year for the last quarter century. In the spring, we plan to offer our full array of concerts, plus the two theatre productions that were delayed last year. This fall, and during the winter months, we have a new slate of performances. We will rehearse and perform with safety in mind, and we are working to stay abreast of all the new developments and best practices concerning COVID-19.

We need your help and patience in these endeavors. We are asking that all patrons wear masks at our events, and that you practice social distancing between your group and other groups or individuals who attend. We ask that you purchase tickets online whenever possible to avoid lines, and that when you are in line at the concession stand or the ticket table, you maintain six feet of distance between yourself and those around you. And finally, we ask for your understanding if these requests result in any delays in the start of an event or the end of an intermission. We are all in this thing together, and we will come through it together. In the event that we face another shutdown or extended limitations on live performances, we will offer at least part of our season virtually, but we will livestream only if the circumstances require that we make performances available in that format.

We don't know what the future holds, but we hope it includes a jubilant gathering at the theatre as you join us for our 26th season. As we continue to navigate these unknown waters, your support is more important than ever. Please accept our humble thanks.
