# Graduation Requirements

	General Diploma	FL SUS College Admissions Minimum Requirements (suggested)
English Credits	4	4 (to include honors, AP and/or DE)
Math Credits	4 (must include Algebra 1 and Geometry)	4 (to include Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2 and 1 higher)
Science Credits	3 (must include Biology and 2 equally rigorous science courses, 2 science courses must include a Lab component)	4 (to include Biology, Chemistry, Physics and 1 higher)
Social Studies Credits	3 (World History, US History, Government and Economics)	4 (to include honors, AP and/or DE)
Foreign Language Credits		2 consecutive years in the same language
PE and Health	HOPE	
Performing/Practical Fine Arts Credit	1	
Electives	8	Additional electives in either honors, AP and/or DE courses
Online Course	1 course within the 24 credits	
GPA	2.0 or higher (unweighted)	
Standardized test	Passing score on 10 <sup>th</sup> grade Reading/Writing FSA (or concordant score on SAT/ACT) Passing score on Algebra 1 EOC (or concordant score on PERT)	

# Scholars and Merit Diploma Options

- See your counselor if you are interested in either diploma option
- Must EOC test no later than the Winter (December) – Cannot sit for Spring EOC's

## Scholars Diploma

- Meet required graduation requirements
- Earn 1.0 credit in Algebra 2
- Earn 1.0 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous course
- Pass the Biology EOC or pass AP Biology exam
- Earn 1.0 credit in Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 1.0 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
- Pass the US History EOC or AP US History exam
- Earn 2 credits in the same World Language
- Earn at least 1.0 credit in an AP or DE course

## Merit Diploma

- Meet required graduation requirements
- Attain one or more industry certifications

# College and Career Planning

- 4 year college or university
  - College Admissions GPA requirements – recalculation of GPA: .5 additional points for Honors, 1.0 additional points for AP and Dual Enrollment courses

    - Guarantee transfer of 60 credits as earned from AA degree

# Is My Transcript Correct.....

- ▶ Seniors should request an unofficial copy of their transcript for review through  
<https://www.parchment.com/u/registration/195244/account>  
correct spelling of name
  - social security number
  - all credits are entered from virtual school and St. Johns River State College
  - courses have been grade forgiven
  - Correct number of service hours
  - SAT/ACT scores have been entered correctly
  - Online course credit has been entered
- **ALL SENIORS ARE REQUIRED TO SIGN UP FOR PARCHMENT IN ORDER TO SEND OUT ANY TRANSCRIPTS**

# Requesting a Transcript

- Transcript request form is located in guidance at Mrs. Hemmer's desk
- Transcripts can be sent electronically to majority of schools nationwide through Parchment
  - <https://www.parchment.com/u/registration/195244/account> – create an account and request transcripts to be sent directly through your account
- All other schools that do not use Parchment – transcripts will cost \$2.00 per transcript
- Dual Enrollment Transcripts – Must request directly from SJRSC

- AP Credits – Must request directly from the College Board

# What are 4 Year Colleges and Universities Looking for in Students for Acceptance

- Academic Rigor
- Strength of Senior schedule
- Courses taken vs. Courses available
- Grade Point Average (GPA)
- SAT/ACT scores – only some require the Writing Portion – students need to check this
- Some schools outside the state of Florida may require 3 years instead of 2 of a World Language – students need to check this
- School and Community Involvement/Leadership
- Community Service



# Types of College Applications

- Online college applications at each colleges website – Typical Way of applying
  - Student sends transcripts directly to college
  - Counselor recommendations not required for Florida public schools
- Common application
  - Transcript is included in counselors piece
  - Counselor recommendation is required for some schools
  - Teacher recommendation is required for some schools
- Send Edu
  - Transcript is included in counselors piece
  - Counselor recommendation required for some schools
- College Net
  - Student sends transcripts directly to college
  - There is a counselor piece
  - Counselor recommendation is not required
- Coalition
  - Transcript includes in counselors piece
  - Counselor recommendation is required for some schools
  - Teacher recommendation is required for some schools

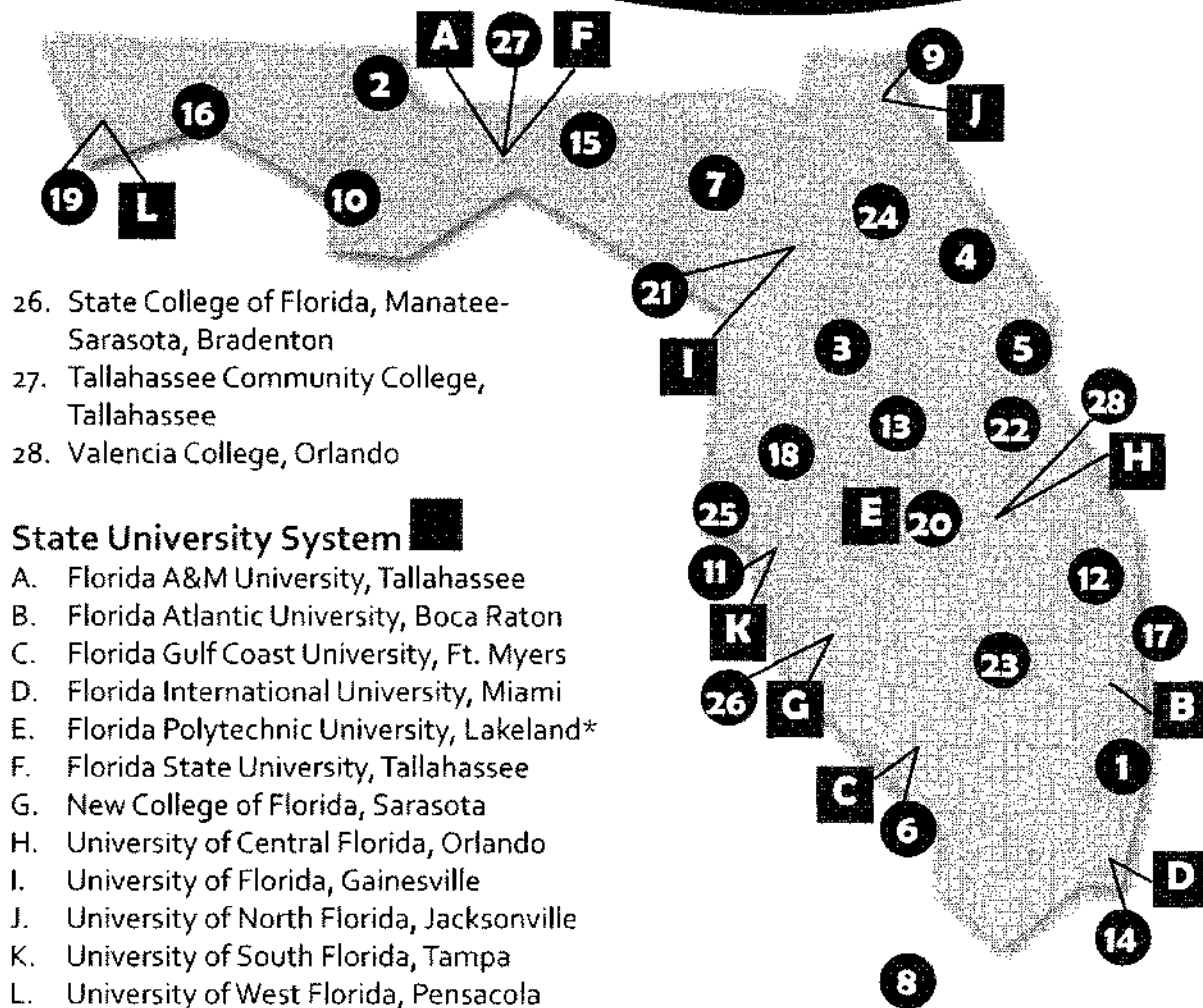


# Public colleges & universities

# General Eligibility Requirements for Bright Futures

- Be a Florida resident and U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen as determined by your postsecondary institution
- Enroll in an eligible Florida public or private postsecondary institution
- Enroll in a minimum of 6 hours per term (or the equivalent)
- Begin using the scholarship funds within two years of graduation
- Must not be found guilty of, or plead no contest to, a felony charge
- Must apply during your last year in high school – Application opens October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017 and closes on your graduation date 2018 – but can continue to qualify with test scores through June 2018

## Florida Academic Scholarship

- 3.5 Weighted GPA
- 16 credits of college prep courses
  - English, Math, Science, SS and World Language
- 100 hours of community service
- 1290 minimum SAT score (reading & math only – No Writing) - they will not combine old and new SAT scores
- **or** 29 minimum composite ACT Score (without Writing)
- Pays 100% of tuition and application fees plus \$300.00 for both fall and spring semester for additional educational expenses at public universities in Florida
- Pays \$211.00 per credit hour plus \$300.00 for both fall and spring semester for additional educational expenses at private universities in Florida

## Florida Medallion Scholarship

- 3.0 Weighted GPA
- 16 credits of college prep courses
  - English, Math, Science, SS and World Languages
- 75 hours of community service
- 1170 minimum SAT score (reading & math only – No Writing) – they will not combine old and new SAT scores
- **or** 26 minimum composite ACT Score (without Writing)
- Pays \$77.00 per credit hour at 4 year
- Pays \$63.00 per credit hour at 2 year
- Pays \$39.00 per credit at Career/Technical Centers

# Florida Bright Futures

## – Gold Seal Vocational Scholars

- 3.0 or higher weighted GPA in non-elective high school courses
- 3 full credits in a single Career and Technical Education Program and earn a 3.5 or higher unweighted GPA in these courses
- 30 hours of community service
- Achieve qualifying test score requirements:
  - ACT – English: 17, Reading: 19 and Math: 19
  - SAT – Reading Test: 24, Writing and Language Test: 25 and Math Test: 24
  - PERT – Reading: 106, Writing: 103 and Math: 114

### **GOLD SEAL SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS CAN ONLY BE USED AT ONE OF THE FOLLOWING PROGRAMS:**

- Pays \$39.00 at a Career Certification Program (PSAV)
- Pays \$39.00 at an Applied Technology Diploma Program (ATD)
- Pays \$48.00 at a Technical Degree Education Program – AA, AAS or CCC

- Opens October 1, 2017
- Apply early – the earlier you apply the more possibility of money
- You will complete this application with your parents
- Reach out to the college or university you are applying to for assistance – you can contact their Financial Aid department
- Federal PELL Grants and Scholarships

- Send out transcripts through Parchment
- Request letters of recommendations
- Seek out scholarships – individual scholarships and from the colleges
- Notify those colleges that you will not attend
- Meet deadlines housing, tuition, etc.
