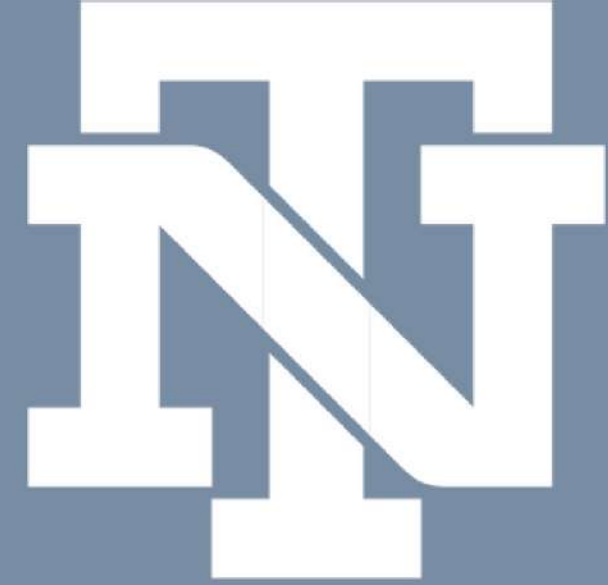

# Senior Project Requirements

Before you go...

- 1 Attend ALL SP Meetings
- 2 Passing all classes/grad requirements met
- 3 90% 2nd Semester Attendance
- 4 Read/Respond to SP emails
- 5 NT & Community Sponsor
- 6 Submit approved proposal



# Senior Project Requirements

During your project...

- 1 Daily Canvas Logs
- 2 Weekly Reflections
- 3 Final Self-Reflection
- 4 Meet with NT mentor 1/wk
- 5 Work with community sponsor
- 6 Works towards goals



# Other FAQ's:



## **Do I attend advisery?**

No! Even if you are on a modified program and coming back for other courses, you DO NOT attend advisery.

## **Do I have to work during traditional school hours?**

No! Some projects may require you to work afternoon, night, or weekend hours...that's OK!

## **Can I plan an out-of-town project?**

Yes! All travel and lodging arrangements must be made by you. You cannot do an out-of-town project if you are on a modified project.

## **Can I do a partner project?**

Depends... as long as there is a good reason that the Project would require two people.

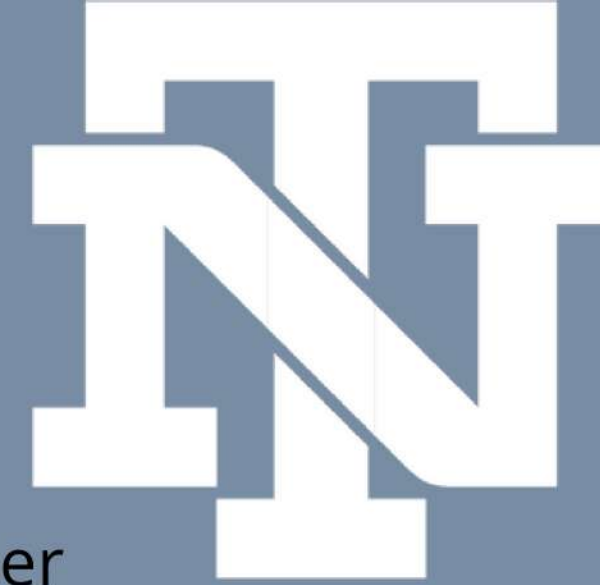

## **Find a New Trier mentor**

Does NOT need to be an expert in the field of your project

## **Come up with project ideas**

## **Find a community sponsor**

Professional outside of NT

Minimum of 25 years old; not related to you

An expert in your area

You will work with them for the duration of your project
