1. Politicians/ Speakers/ Historical Figures
 - a. Obama, JFK, George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Teddy Roosevelt, Steve Jobs etc.
2. Authors
 - a. Maya Angelou, Dr. Seuss, Oscar Wilde, JK Rowling, etc.
3. Plays/ Musicals
 - a. *Wicked*, *Mamma Mia*, *Les Misérables*, *The Phantom of the Opera*, etc.
4. Novels
 - a. *Harry Potter*, *Invisible Man*, *Wuthering Heights*, *1984*, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, etc.
5. Religious Texts
 - a. The Bible, the Quran, the Torah, etc.

We will NOT be accepting quotes from movies, TV Programs, music, or anonymous speakers.

We will not accept:

We will accept:

Things to remember about quotes:

Use correct capitalization.

- Capitalize all names of people.
- In texts capitalize the nouns and first words, but do not capitalize articles (an, a, the) or prepositions (on, in, of, etc.)

Italicize and use quotes correctly.

- Italicize the titles of books, plays, speeches, and long poems.
- Do not italicize religious works.

Include the author and title of the work.

- “If you want to know what a man’s like, take a good look at how he treats his inferiors, not his equals.” – J.K. Rowling, *Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire*

Correctly cite Bible verses.

“I can do all this through him who gives me strength.” – Philippians 4:13, NIV

When you choose a play, musical, novel, or actor, the quote must be from the actual text and

NOT A MOVIE ADAPTATION.

For example, when you are quoting Romeo and Juliet, you must choose the quote from Shakespeare and not Leonardo Dicaprio.

How to submit your senior quote
