

Reread to boost fluency

Fluency is the ability to read quickly and easily. A fluent reader doesn't pause to decode words.

You can help your child become a fluent reader by encouraging him to

read and reread favorite books. When he is familiar with the text—and when the reading gets a little easy—he doesn't have

to focus on figuring out each word. Instead, he can focus on reading with speed and expression.

Get Your Midway Multiplication License!

Students are encouraged to practice their multiplication facts 2-12 until fluent. A recommended practice tool is www.coolmath4kids.com or the use of flash cards.

Students will let their teacher know when they are ready to apply for the license. The teacher will test the student using a timed test.

If the student passes the test, they will be issued a multiplication license.
