Our first month back to school has been busy; learning, growing and rediscovering many of the joys of learning that we missed during the last couple of years. It is great to see our children's beautiful smiles again and also to reintroduce more cooperative learning to enrich our academic experiences. One event that was put on pause during the pandemic was our open house. We will bring this event back on Tuesday, September 13th. Open house will start with an optional walking tour of our campus at 4:45 for those families who are new to our school or who haven't had the opportunity to see the beautiful Hanalei School grounds in the past couple of years. Classrooms will open at 5 PM for you to meet your child(ren)'s teachers and see all the great work your child(ren) are already doing in school. Thanks to the generosity of our wonderful PTA we will have free pizza available in the cafe. ## 1st GRADE Mrs. Paik, Mrs. Fredericksen & Ms. Vogts








# 3rd GRADE Mr. Andrews & Mrs. Swenson

In Science, we started the year with our lab on soils and landforms. This is tied into our lessons on the history of how the islands are formed and learning about Hawaiian myths of how the islands were created. The students are creating some great posters on our islands and will be ready to share open house!

## 5th GRADE Ms. Gallagher & Ms. Collins

Ms Collins' Class: We kicked off the school year with a new math program called "Envision Math". This program incorporates critical thinking and offers many exciting components including "Pick a Project." The students are deep into their first Social Studies research project about Native Americans, and in Science they are learning about the solar system through hands on activities presented by Mrs. K. One science lesson focused on how to tell the time of the day by our shadows. Last, but not least, in ELA students are learning and applying comprehension strategies, using new vocabulary and we've been having a lot of fun learning about homophones and homographs





Taco 'Bout an Amazing Class! In addition to ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies, a class focus is social emotional learning. Every month, students write thoughtful, positive statements about a classmate, chosen at random. The statements are compiled onto a poster board for all to read. The students truly enjoy reading what their classmates have written about them!



From Ms Gallagher's class: It has been a wonderful start to a new school year. Grade 5 is exploring perspective in art with some very creative drawings. Poetry is first on the agenda with the writing projects a "Silly Poem". In Science, the solar

system is our topic. In Math, students are being challenged with our new "Envisions Math" curriculum. We are looking forward to a wonderful year!



## 6th GRADE Mrs. Adams & Ms. Ricardo







6th grade students are off to a great start in Mrs. Adams' math and science classes. In math, the students are working on quickly and fluently adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing both decimal numbers and numbers that are fractions. In science, students learned about the scientific method and the engineering design process. They are now taking this information and applying it to real life in order to come up with an idea for their individual science projects. The ideas that have been submitted for projects so far are SUPER innovative!



In Ms. Ricardo's class, the 6th graders have started the year off learning their new routines and getting acclimated to the middle school-style schedule and expectionations of two teachers. In Language Arts they have been busy doing a comprehensive review of grammar and writing to set a solid foundation for the coming months. They have started a mini writing project focusing on their favorite physical feature to nurture a healthy self-image. Additionally, in Social Studies, they are learning the basics of how to conduct historical research, paraphrase big ideas and geographical terms to support their future understanding of how early civilizations used the land forms to their advantage. In art they started the year off with a collage type drawing focusing on their family, their history, their future and interests in a project called "Mo'olelo of Me".
