Course Objectives

Students in the Beginning bands are either in their first year of playing their instrument. Students in these classes will learn basic rhythm and note reading skills and will be introduced to playing their instruments. The overall goal will be to eventually play altogether as the beginning band.

Online Platform Information: (Google Meets/Webex Google Classroom and Flipgrid)

Google Meets will be our primary video conferencing platform where we will have online class everyday. IF for some reason Webex goes down or doesn't work we will switch to **Webex**.

In this class we will be using **Google Classroom** as the online learning platform. Please check Google Classroom daily for assignments, due dates, discussions, and announcements.

Flipgrid is a free online software platform where students will post short video excerpts of themselves playing an assigned section of music and will receive feedback from other students. Students and parents will receive a lesson from the instructor on how to post and operate from the online platform. If for any reason the student is unable to post to the platform he or she has to communicate this to the instructor <u>at least 2 days</u> before the due date of the video post and an alternate format will be worked out for the particular assignment.

Expectations (in-person & Online Meetings)

Online Meetings (Netiquitee)

- Be on time - Be on time and prepared with your device charged. Close material and tabs from other classes. Make sure all tech works 5-10 minutes before the meeting.

- Mute yourself - Mute yourself right away to eliminate background noise.

- Presentation - Consider your surroundings and attire. Find a good spot in the home with few distractions and make sure you're wearing something appropriate for the day.

- Headphones Use headphones if you have them. If your headphones or earbuds have a microphone, even better.
- Signals Use hand signals:
- Thumbs up = Yes/Thumbs down = No
- Hand by ear = Can't hear
- Raise hand = Have a comment
- Be Respectful Follow the agreements of the group.
- Adhere to TRUF for appropriate use of technology

Guidelines for Assignments:

Assignments are done legibly and with reasonable care/effort. Students are expected to participate in all projects and discussions. Assignments must be complete and on time, unless a parent note is submitted with reason.

Grades will be updated every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month.

All assignments will be submitted by 2:15pm on their due dates.

Absence work policy: Students are responsible for acquiring make-up work and submitting it as soon as possible. For long-term absences, parents may request work by calling the school and picking it up at the office.

Performance Tests – 35%

Beginning students will perform weekly on selected excerpts either coming from one of their method books or literature that we are currently working on.

Instrument assignments/Fingering Test - 15%

Before the fingering tests, students will be given instrument assignments based on their instrument to help familiarize them with the instruments they are playing and to better their understanding as musicians.

Closer to the end of 2nd, 3rd, and 4th quarter a fingering test appropriate for the instrument of the particular student will be administered.

Ample time will be given to study for these fingering tests. Students will be allowed to use their instruments as a guide, but will not be allowed to use their method books during the test. In the online format the test will be given in a Google form format and monitored by the instructor during one class with webcams on. In the classroom format students will be given a sheet test equal to that of the Google Form test for the online students, but pertinent to their own particular instrument. (Ie. Clarinet test for the clarinet player.)

Weekly Practice Minute Goals Forms and – PMGF Program 30% Beginning Band Students are required 90 minutes of practice a week

*Something different with these is that the students will also learn how to establish proper "goals" in what they want to accomplish while practicing and write them on their sheet and have it approved every **MONDAY** before the start of the new practice sheet rotation. Each student will turn in their sheet every **MONDAY** signed.

Due to the nature of "full distance learning" students will take a picture of the form signed by their parent or guardian and filled out and turn it into the Google Classroom page.

Students may practice in school (before school, recess, lunch, after-school) or at home. Class time does not count towards PMF credit.

Weekly Performance Post and Commenting to Flipgrid - 10%

As stated above **Flipgrid** is a free online platform where students will post short videos of themselves playing a certain excerpt and practice commenting and positively evaluating themselves as well as their peers. If for any reason the student is unable to post to the platform he or she has to communicate this to the instructor<u>at least</u> <u>2 days</u> before the due date of the video post and an alternate format will be worked out for the particular assignment.

Classroom Participation/Behavior/Netiquette - 10%

Classroom participation (have required supplies & playing your instrument daily in class) & following classroom rules both in person and online will result in an A.
