  - d. Make a bulleted list of at least 4 other literary devices (do not include theme as it will be dealt with later) used by the author (use the Literary Term Post Test list or choose other devices). List the device and the example from the story.
  - e. Make a slide (or sheet) giving your opinion of the story. This should be a lengthy paragraph at least 5 sentences. Extra Points = Find a critique about your author and include it on this slide (or sheet) as well.
  - f. Notable Quotables Make a bulleted list of at least 3 meaningful quotes from the story.
  - g. Themes Make a bulleted list of possible themes from the story. Include at least 2.
- C) Presentation of Power Point or Poster (50 Points)
  - a. You must present your story to the class using the power point or the poster you created as your visual.
  - b. You must write notes on a sheet that will be provided for you in which you will record data from the presentations that your peers give.
