Principal's Message:





THINK PREVENTION during activities and travel over the holidays with family and friends:

Head Injuries-Most childhood head injuries are minor and hurt only the outside of the head. On rare occasions, a severe head injury can cause bruising or bleeding in the brain. This type of head injury requires immediate medical attention.

Prevention: Make sure kids wear protective gear for contact sports, biking, skating, and skateboarding.

Head Lice-A head louse is a tiny, wingless insect that can attach to a person's hair where it feeds on extremely small amounts of blood drawn from the scalp. Lice aren't dangerous and they don't spread disease. They are seen more commonly in children.

Prevention- Try to avoid head-to-head contact with other children. Do not share combs, brushes, hair ties, etc. or lie on bedding, pillows, and carpets that have recently been used by someone with lice.



Instructional Coach Suggestions:

- Set a timer for 30 minutes each day to monitor independent reading time at home.
