Reading

Target: Students will be able to determine the theme of a story and cite textual evidence that is stated or implied

As a school, we will...

- Teachers will provide parents with the definition of theme, textual evidence, and other key terms
- Teachers will provide parents examples of short story themes, citing stated textual evidence, and citing implied textual evidence
- Teachers will provide generic questions parents may ask students to practice determining theme

As a parent, I will...

- Review key terms and definitions with my child
- Review citing textual evidence and determining theme with my child
- Practice reviewing theme by asking my child questions provided by the teacher

As a student, I will...

- Review key terms and definitions for theme, textual evidence, and other key terms at home
- Use examples provided by teachers at home when citing textual evidence
- Answer generic questions sent home by teachers to determine the theme of stories read

Math

Target: Students will be able to fluently add/subtract/multiply/divide whole numbers and decimals, and explain the relationship between percentages/decimals/fractions

As a school, we will...

- Teachers will provide multiplication charts and conversion charts with decimals, percentages, and fractions for home
- Teachers will provide flash cards for students or instructions for making flash cards

As a parent, I will...

- Review math charts sent home and keep them accessible for my child to use at home
- Use flash cards to practice math facts with my child

As a student, I will...

- Use math charts sent home by teacher to help develop fluency with math facts
- Use flash cards to practice and master math facts
