He earned his BA in Economics from the University of North Florida in 2013, subsequently moving to Kansas and apprenticing at Spinning Earth Pottery with Danny Meisinger. In 2017 he graduated from Fort Hays State University with an MFA in Ceramics. Herrick is a husband, father, potter, and high school ceramics teacher who focuses on local clays and atmospheric firing. When not in the classroom or studio he loves the outdoors.

SESSION TITLE: Using Paper to Prototype Cup Templates

ROOM # A Hall 320

Artist and educator Herrick H. Smith will lead a hands-on systematic workshop on the planning stages and template portion of a clay hand-building unit with soft slabs of clay to create drinking vessels. Smith will guide participants through design techniques for working with sketches to produce paper models of ceramic cups and how to plan and execute assembly for optimal results. This workshop will produce a paper model cup for each participant and a turnkey unit plan complete with the timeline of formative and summative assignments ready-to-go when you return to your class. *Does not include working with clay during workshop* Additionally, the workshop addresses different cup shapes and how form/volume relates to function/intended liquid. This unit plan is intentionally plastic and can serve as a launch point for many other ideas. For example, simply trade out the cup for a bowl or plate and address geometry and history with imperial Chinese porcelain. Or, roll the first 4 assignments into a geometry unit on volumes. This workshop will produce a paper model cup for each participant and provide a turn-key unit plan complete with the timeline of assignments ready-to-go when you return to your class. *Does not include working with clay during workshop*. The lesson is a cross-curricular link, addressing high school math, language arts, and visual arts standards.
