RE: **SY 2019 - 2020 Operational Memo #6 - REVISED**
Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program Application, SY 19-20

This memo is being revised due to an error in the end date.

The *Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program* (FFVP), under Section 19 of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (NSLA), has been a nationwide program since 2008 and operates in selected elementary schools in the 50 States, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. Participating schools must offer fresh fruits and vegetables as a snack to students during the school day. FFVP food items cannot be served at breakfast, at lunch, or in an afterschool program. Because the FFVP targets low-income students, schools will be selected based on the percentage of students who are eligible for free and reduced-price meals. The number of schools selected will be based upon the amount of funding awarded to Delaware.

Elementary Schools* will be selected from those applications submitted to the state agency based on guidance in this letter and oversight by the United States Department of Agriculture, Section 19 of the National School Lunch Act. Please note, only grades K-6 are eligible to participate in the FFVP. Application data should reflect enrollment and free/reduced data for elementary students (K-6) only.

**"Elementary School", for purposes of this regulation, shall mean a school with a grade configuration including any of the following: Kindergarten, grade 1, grade 2, grade 3, grade 4, grade 5, or grade 6. However, a school that has grade 6 as its lowest grade level may be considered a Middle School or Secondary School as those terms are defined in this regulation herein (Delaware Code, Title 14, Regulation 103.1.2).*

There is one grant allocation for FFVP that will cover the period of **October 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020**. The level of funding provided to any one school will be a minimum of \$50 per student per year. **To ensure that all awarded schools provide a minimum of \$50 per student, our office will no longer grant requests to move funds from one school to another school, even within an SFA.**

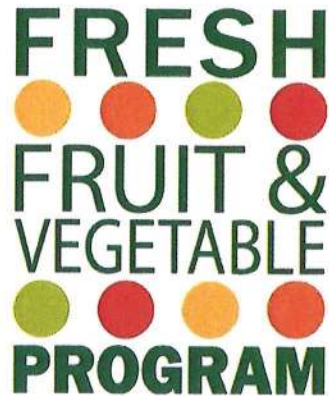
To be considered for this program, completed application packages (**paper or electronic copies**) must be received by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, August 30, 2019. Please refer to the FFVP application for submission options.

About the Program

The *Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program*, under Section 19 of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (NSLA) has been a nationwide program since 2008. Participating schools must offer fresh fruits and vegetables as a snack to students during the school day. FFVP food items cannot be served at breakfast, at lunch, or in an afterschool program. Because the FFVP targets low-income students, schools will be selected based on the percentage of students who are eligible for free and reduced-price meals. FFVP funding is available from October 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The level of funding provided to any one school will be a minimum of \$50 per student per year.

Selection Criteria

Schools will be selected from those applications submitted to the state agency based on guidance in this letter and oversight by the United States Department of Agriculture. Section 19 of the National School Lunch Act requires the following selection criteria for participating schools:

- ***Elementary school** - must operate the National School Lunch Program with 50 percent or more students who are eligible for free or reduced-priced meals. The highest priority will be given to schools with the highest percentage of low-income students to the maximum extent possible. (Note: Only grades K-6 are eligible to participate in FFVP.)
- Schools must submit a plan for implementation of the program to provide a team approach within the school and district. The plan should integrate the FFVP with other efforts to promote sound health and nutrition, reduce overweight and obesity, and encourage physical activity.
- Additionally, schools must complete a certification of support with original signatures of the school nutrition supervisor, food service manager, school principal, and district superintendent or equivalent positions as determined by the school.

*In Delaware, an *elementary school* is defined as a school with any, or all, of grades kindergarten through grade 6; "however, a school that has grade 6 as its lowest grade level may be considered a Middle or Secondary School (Delaware Code, Title 14, Regulation 103.1.2)

Use of funds

Funds are to be used primarily to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables to serve for no charge to students. A small percentage of funds may be used for operating and administrative costs such as ready-to-use produce, preparation, and distribution of fruits and vegetables. The proposal narrative should specify the types of anticipated equipment expenditures a school might incur. Claims for reimbursement will be processed through the school's child nutrition program.

How to Apply

Completed application packages (paper or electronic copies) must be received by 4:30 p.m. **August 30, 2019**. Each school that is interested in applying for the FFVP must apply separately. If your LEA has multiple schools, each school must submit a separate application. You must answer all of the questions on the following pages. If not all of the questions are answered, the application will be considered incomplete and will not be considered. We hope that you will consider participating in the FFVP and help your students develop lifelong healthy eating habits.
