#### Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test

- Wednesday, October 11<sup>th</sup> during the regular school day
- ♦ The state of Florida covers the cost of this testing for all 10<sup>th</sup> grade students

#### **SAT/ACT Testing**

#### College entrance

- Measurement of college readiness
- Most colleges and universities use these scores as an evaluation to measure college success in their institution

### Difference between SAT & ACT

#### SAT

- An aptitude test
- Tests reasoning and verbal abilities
- **Tests primarily 2 components** 
  - ♦ Math
    - **⋄** Some parts without calculator
  - **⋄** Reading
  - **⋄** Verbal language
  - **⋄** Optional writing

#### ACT

- **♦** An achievement test
- Measures what a student has learned in school
- **♦ 5 Components** 
  - ♦ English
  - **⋄** Reading
  - **⋄** Math
    - ♦ All parts allow for calculator
  - **⋄** Science
  - ♦ Optional essay

Both recognized by college and universities for acceptance





# **Graduation Requirements**

| Foreign Language Credits    |   | 2 consecutive years in the same language                      |
| PE and Health               | HOPE  |   |
| Performing Fine Arts Credit | 1 Credit  |   |

| Online Course               | 1 course within the 24 credits  |   |
| GPA                         | 2.0 or higher (unweighted)  |   |

## **GPA**

#### Unweighted GPA – Graduation GPA

• All courses (academic and elective) are averaged into the GPA; (Based on the 4.0 point system)

#### Weighted GPA - Ranking GPA

- All courses (academic and elective) are averaged into the GPA; grade forgiveness applies
- .5 weight for honors, 1.0 weight for AP and DE

#### Bright Futures GPA and College Admissions GPA

- All CORE academic courses plus 2 years of Foreign Language and 2 academic electives
- .5 weight for honors, AP and DE for Bright Futures
- .5 weight for honors, 1.0 weight for AP and DE for College Admissions



# Dual Enrollment (DE) verses Advanced Placement (AP)

#### DE

- DE course scores are based on the grade earned by the end of the course
- DE courses may take place either at the high school or at a local college.
- DE courses count toward your college GPA

#### AP

- AP course scores are based on a national standardized exam
- AP students take the course in a high school setting with other high school students
- AP courses do NOT count toward your college GPA

## **Diploma Designations**

# Meet all requirements of the standard diploma plus:

#### **Scholar Designation**

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra II
- Pass the Geometry EOC, Biology EOC, & U.S. History EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
- Earn 1 credit in either Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 1 credit in an equally rigorous course to Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 2 credits in the same world language
- Earn at least 1 credit in AP or Dual Enrollment

OR

#### **Merit Designation**

Attain one or more approved industry certifications (in one of the academy programs at CHS)


