TESTING BASICS & UPDATES

Our recommendation remains firm that it's best to take the ACT and/or SAT in late winter or early spring of junior year. Students will have the option to take the PSAT on October 19th, and all students are required to take the Illinois State ACT in April 2025. NEED SOME SUMMER PLANS?

Consider the wide variety of ways you can use your time constructively this summer...

- Consider finding a part-time job, pursuing volunteer work, or learning a new skill. Check out the New Trier Job Board (keep scrolling to link to it!). It can also be found on our website or the Resources page in MaiaLearning and in PHSC Canvas.
- Look for ways to help! Be a mentor to a sibling; do chores around the house (without being asked!); help an elderly neighbor with their yard work. Think of ways you can contribute. COLLEGE VISITS

EXPLORE OPTIONS FOR HOW TO RESEARCH COLLEGES

Check each college website for availability of on-campus or virtual visit options, such as:

- Admission information sessions
- Chat sessions with your local representative
- Virtual tours

By registering for and attending on-campus and virtual sessions, colleges will be able to know you're actively researching all they have to offer. Utilizing virtual offerings can be a useful way to prioritize where you will want to visit when you are ready.

LOOKING AHEAD...

ON THE HORIZON FOR JUNIOR YEAR

Most notably, as sophomores become juniors, we will be engaging each student in their post-high school planning process with advisory visits in the fall and an evening program in November. We will introduce and guide each junior through the completion of a student reflection and data form which will be due in December. Individual family meetings will begin in January of junior year and continue throughout the rest of the school year.

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FINANCIAL AID

If you are interested in getting a better handle on the cost of college and what aid you may qualify for, there are a few tools you will want to check out.

NET PRICE CALCULATOR

All colleges are federally mandated to have a Net Price Calculator on their website. To find this on a school's site, simply type "Net Price Calculator" into the search bar. To access a comprehensive listing of all college calculators, click [HERE](#).

Completing this 15-20 minute exercise will provide you with an early read on what need-based or merit-based aid you might qualify for at this institution.

FEDERAL STUDENT AID ESTIMATOR

While the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Aid) cannot be completed until fall of the senior year, you can complete the Federal Student Aid Estimator now to get an estimate of your eligibility for federal aid. 2ND SEMESTER

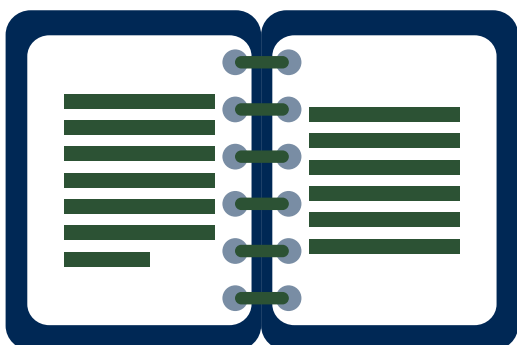

State ACT for Juniors (an Illinois state-mandated graduation requirement). More information will be shared by the testing office as it becomes available.

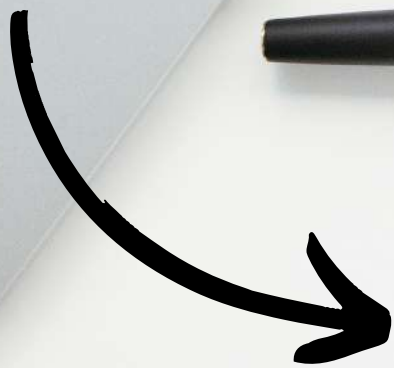
