Course Description:

Rules

Detentions

If you are required to serve a detention, a time will be arranged between the student and Teacher. Detentions must be served within one week of when it is given. If a student cannot serve before or after school detention, they may be required to complete an alternative assignment or help with other classroom tasks as assigned by the teacher.

Absences and Make-up Work

**Students are responsible for collecting any work missed during their absence <u>outside</u> <u>of class</u> or during class work time. Please do not attempt to do this in the middle of class as We am trying to start a new day. If you fail to collect your work and complete it, it will be counted as late.

**Your teacher reserves the right to keep any work, homework, tests or quizzes. She may never return some work back to students.

Quizzes are given on a regular basis usually once or twice per week; sometimes more. Tests are generally every 2 to 3 weeks, usually Wednesdays or Fridays.

Cheating

Cheating will be addressed per the student handbook. However, please be aware that there is a fine line between "cheating" and "working together." Students are expected to do their own work, including homework, projects, quizzes, and tests etc. unless otherwise stated in writing. Anyone caught cheating, it will be an automatic 0.

Online Translators: Online translators can be an excellent resource for students. However, I strongly encourage you to avoid them. Oftentimes they are incorrect or inaccurate. Using an online translator for an entire sentence/paragraph translations is considered cheating and will result in a loss of credit for the assignment. This includes looking up answers to classwork questions instead of doing it yourself.

Speaking

Speaking in the target language and presenting in front of the class or Teacher is an integral part of the course. Unless you provide medical documentation as to why you cannot present with others or in front of others, you will be expected to do so.

Semester Projects

Students will have the option of completing a semester project outside of class for recovery credit as a summative assignment. See Teacher for more details if you are interested.

Projects

There is a project for nearly every unit, in addition to lessons not included in the text. These are a great way to engage in hands-on, project-based learning. It is imperative to complete projects in order to succeed. You will receive plenty of class time to do so.

Hall Passes

Please ask permission to leave the class using the target language. Only one student will be allowed to leave the room at a time. You must sign out, sign back in, and carry a hall pass at all times.

Grading Scale

Percentages for letter grades are determined as stated per the student handbook.

Grades are weighted in the following categories:

- 71% Summative (major quizzes, tests, and large projects)
- 29% Formative (daily work, speaking, minor quizzes, other)
- 20% Final Exam (weighted with the semester grade score)
