DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Exhibits a professional attitude and demeanor at all time in dealing with the board of education, school administration, other employees, parents, students, and the public
- Demonstrates knowledge and proficiency in the use of computer applications as applicable to job responsibilities
- Demonstrates appropriate verbal and written communication skills
- Complies with local, state, and federal regulations and policies, including the PSC Code of Ethics, as related to job requirements
- Maintains confidentiality of sensitive information and material
- Follows system chain of command
- Maintains and improves knowledge and skills to promote proficiency in the operations of the system
- Participates in professional organizations and professional development as deemed necessary by the Special Education Director
- Shows initiative and assumes responsibility for all aspects of position; performs routine duties and tasks with little or no direct supervision required

- Assesses student progress at the end of each session and uses this information for future therapy planning
- Implements short and long-term goals of the individual educational program by use of appropriate therapeutic approaches
- Provides diagnostic, remedial and consultative services for students with receptive/expressive communicative disorders
- Participates as a member of the special services and academic multidisciplinary teams
- Recognizes the importance of regular attendance to the speech and language programs and that consistent absenteeism will impair the continuity of that program
- Keeps in confidence information that has been obtained in the course of professional service with respect to students, parents, and other staff members, unless disclosure serves professional purposes or is required by law
