- Human Characteristics, such as population settlement patterns, and human activities, such as agriculture and industry, can describe a place. For example, New York City is a very densely populated area, which has shaped the geography in that the need for personal automobiles are not as common as they are in Thomson, Georgia
- Interrelationship between physical and human characteristics of a place (The two listed above give you a well rounded view of a particular area)

* Standard 2: Cultural Aspect of Geography

- Describe the concept of place by explaining how the culture of a region is a product of the region's physical characteristics. In other words, if the region has soil good for growing cotton, the area will become a producer of cotton.
- Explain how cultural characteristics of a place can be used to describe a place. For example, Red Necks are from the South
- Analyze how physical factors such as mountains, climate, and bodies of water interact with the people of a region to produce a distinctive culture. For example, a mountainous region will probably have ski resorts
- Explain how the development of customs and traditions help to define a culture and a people. For example, people are viewed as more polite in the South, because that is part of the South's way of life
