

## St. Johns County School District Deferment Options Matrix

Only a student whose IEP requires special education, transition planning, transition services, or related services through the age of 21 may defer receipt of their standard diploma. In addition, once a student defers, they must be enrolled in accelerated college credit instruction, industry certification courses that lead to college credit, a collegiate high school program, courses necessary to satisfy the Scholar designation requirements or a structured work-study, internship or pre-apprenticeship program in order to continue to receive FAPE (s.1003.4282(10)(c), F.S)

A transition program for students who have completed graduation requirements. Students spend their day learning valuable vocational, daily living, independent functioning, real world academic, and self-advocacy/self-determination skills in real world settings. Students participate in unpaid community based work experiences in areas of their interest to gain marketable job skills. Students also create a resume and develop interview skills.

A transition program for students with disabilities who are willing and ready to train to work! Project SEARCH St. Johns will provide for students to be fully immersed in the hotel setting, participating in 3, 10-week internships to:

- Acquire competitive, transferable, and marketable job skills
- Gain increased independence, confidence, and self-esteem
- Obtain work based individualized coaching, instruction, and feedback
- Develop linkages to Vocational Rehabilitation, Arc, APD, and other adult service agencies

\*Students are selected based on an application and skills assessment/interview process \*Students must be clients of Vocational Rehabilitation, eligible for Supported Employment services
