

What is Indicator 13?

- Indicator 13 measures the percentage of students who are 16 years of age and older with an IEP
- This IEP must include appropriate transition assessment and transition services (including course of student) that will allow the student to meet those postsecondary goals
- The student must be invited to attend this IEP team meeting where transition is discussed


Who does Indicator 13 apply to?

- Illinois school code requires that a student's IEP must contain a transition plan by the time the student is 14 ½ years of age
- Please note, Fund Code L,P,N and U do not require a transition plan



How to complete the form...

- Each questions has to be answered Yes or No
 - 8 questions with sub-questions below
- The answer to each questions dictates the automated answers to 8s. And 8t.



Does the IEP meet the requirements of Indicator 13?

- Yes: If items 1a. through 8r. are ALL answered Yes, then the IEP meets Indicator 13 requirements.
- Yes: If items 1a. through 7q., 8s. And 8t. are ALL answered **Yes** AND 8r. is answered **No**, then the IEP meets Indicator 13 requirements.
- No: If one or more items were answered **No**, with the exception of 8r., then the IEP does not meet Indicator 13 requirements. (Out of compliance)
