Community Service/ Capstone Project for GaDOE Diploma Seal:

Students must complete 20 community service hours. It is preferred the hours are earned towards a final capstone project. Ideas include:

- Art students volunteering to work at an elementary art show (3 hours), help hang work in the BOE (2 hours), NAHS work (15 hours) Capstone is assisting with the design and implementation of Senior art show.
- Performing Arts students creating small student-led ensembles to perform at various venues, including middle school recruitment, elementary classes or fine arts
 nights, assisted living facilities, school events, etc. Capstone is the culmination of the small group performance with either a short talk describing their work or
 presentation of their work throughout the year.
- Students should give a presentation in the format of their choice to report and reflect on the fine arts experiences in which they have engaged. Creative ideas are encouraged for the presentations (e.g. art, performance, journal reading, video, presentation). Students are expected to reflect on the fine arts skills and creative industry competencies during the senior project presentation.
