1. economy	an organized way in which people <mark>produce</mark> sell and <mark>buy</mark> goods and services
2) map	a drawing or picture showing the <u>features</u> of an area
3) compass rose	a device drawn on <u>maps</u> to show <u>directions</u>
4) scale	found on a map, it shows the relationship between distance on a map and the actual distance on the earth
5) cardinal directions	the basic directions on earth: north, south, east and west
6) intermediate directions	any directions <i>between</i> the cardinal directions such as northwest, <u>northeast</u> , southeast, and <u>southwest</u>
7) absolute location	the <u>exact</u> spot on earth where a place can be found.
8) relative location	the location of one place in relation to <u>another</u>
9) place	one of the 5 themes of geography; describes the characteristics that distinguish one place from another
10) region	one of the 5 themes of geography; it defines parts of the <u>earth</u> that <u>share</u> common characteristics
11) movement	one of the 5 themes of geography; it describes how people from different places interact
12) migration	movement from one place to another to settle or live
13) conflict	clashing or sharp <u>disagreements</u>

14) producers	growing <u>agricultural</u> products or manufacturing items or articles
15. consumers	those who use <mark>goods</mark> or services
16) distribution	the process of dividing goods and <u>services</u>
17) culture	a way of life in which a group of people share similar beliefs and religion, language, art, music, food, etc.
18) religion	service and worship of God; or the worship system of sacred beliefs and practices
