2016-2017 Summary of School Compacts

Overview of the entire School Compact

Our school compacts for grades kindergarten thru fifth focus on increasing math scores on the Georgia Milestones test. School Compact Input forms for the 2016-2017 school compact were distributed in the months of September and October along with the parental involvement policy for parent input. Parents were informed to review the school compact to make informed decisions.

287 or 81% of parents of students in grades kindergarten through fifth grade returning the compact parent input form agreed that the focus for the school compacts should be to focus on increasing literacy and numeracy across the curriculum. Of the 356 forms returned, **6 or 2%** of our parents disagreed with the focus being on increasing literacy and numeracy across the curriculum. **806** number of compacts and parent input forms were distributed. **356** parent input forms were returned. **63** Kindergarten, **64** first grade, **36** second grade, **73** third grade, **51** fourth grade, **69** fifth grade.

Parents' responses were analyzed and identified the major trends of the parent responses. The table below shows the input of parents who answered.

Overview:

The majority of parent responses (154) across all grade levels reflect that parents believe that if children read more they would improve with practice. Similarly, across the grade levels, parent responses reflected that practice, flash cards, knowing math facts (99) would help their child in Math. The responses parents offered are in alignment with what parents felt they could support in past compacts. Kindergarten parents acknowledged that their children needed assistance in number (23 responses) and letter recognition and with sight words and phonics (sounding out words) (21 responses). Parents of upper grade students are moving towards their students taking more responsibility for their learning by suggesting that their children pose questions in class when they don’t understand what they are learning. Most all parents agreed that they should help with homework and that reading and practicing reading and math daily will help their children improve academically.
