Assignment 1: Communication & Technology

Task 1: Sign up for Remind: Text shsibart to 81010

Task 2: Text your frequently used email address via Remind.

Assignment 2: Comparative Study Research

Research three artworks. Two can be from the same artist. Choose artworks that are from very different time periods and very different artist styles/movements. You may <u>NOT</u> choose Van Gogh's *Starry Nigh*t or Edvard Munch's *The Scream*.


Task 1: In your IB sketchbook, Create a two-page layout where you document your research for all three images. Print color copies of each artwork and glue them into your sketchbook. They should be no bigger than 2"x 4". Leave enough room for a brief biography of each artist, then describe in **DEPTH** the style/movement of each artwork, the time period in which it was created, the cultural significance, and the symbolism and meaning of each piece. Write your text neatly and use a FINE POINT sharpie pen so your text is visible. You may paint and decorate the background pages as you wish.

Task 2: Create another two page layout. Compare and contrast each of the three pieces. You may draw a graphic organizer of any kind as long as it is sensible. Compare each of the elements listed in Task 1. You may include the images once again, but this is optional. Make a note of any similarities and highlight the differences. Go Deep! Compare the artworks using many different lenses. (Social, Historical, and Cultural)

<u>Assignment 3:</u> Illumination Alphabet Sketchbook (Please see Sketchbook Layout Format Guide)

This sketchbook assignment is focused on improving your hand lettering skills. You will use this skill to title headings throughout each of your journal assignments.

- **1. Research** Illumination Manuscripts. Take a moment and study the detailed calligraphy and pictures that were drawn around the first letter of the page.
- **2. Look up** Calligraphy and different Font Style. (Graffiti, Block, Bubbles, Script etc. Copy or create your own version of the alphabet. At the top of the left page of your sketchbook create a header for the Phrase "Illumination Alphabet" in the font of your choice. Underneath the heading create your alphabet. You may start in pencil, but finish the alphabet using a sharpie pen. **Leave space for a reflection at the bottom of the page.**
- **3.** Create an illuminated page of your first or last name on the right page of this layout. If you need space you may turn your book the long way (landscape) and Illuminate the first letter then finish the rest of your name with the font style you have chosen. Use color, designs, zentangles etc. This design should capture your style/personality.
- **4. Reflect:** Once you are finished go back and write about your feelings and experience with this assignment. How has your view of calligraphy or hand lettering changed? What have you discovered about your ability to hand-letter?

<u>Assignment 4:</u> About me: Who am I? Self-Portrait (Please see Sketchbook Layout Format Guide)

This sketchbook assignment is focused on expressing yourself as a person and an artist. Choosing the theme of your I.A. (Final Exhibition) will be greatly influenced by who you are as a person and all of your personal experiences.

1. Research: Art and Identity, Self-portraits, Autobiographical Art and other ways artists present themselves to the world.

2. Read This Article:



Pick two artists mentioned in the article that stand out to you. On the top half of the left side of this two-page layout print a self-portrait by each of the two artists, then explain the various ways each artist used symbolism, principles of design and aesthetic choices to express themselves in their art. At the bottom leave room for a reflection box.

- **3. Print** several pictures of yourself glue them on the bottom half of the left page, then answer the question Who am I? Consider all the things that make you, you! Life experiences, culture, ethnicity etc.
- 4. **Create:** On the right side of this layout create a self portrait in any media you choose. Consider the artwork you saw in the article. Be sure to include imagery that helps the viewer define who you are.
- **5. Reflect:** Once you are finished go back and write about your feelings and experience with this assignment. How has your view of portraiture or certain artists' changed? What have you discovered about yourself?







Assignment 5: High Contrast Photography (Please see Sketchbook Layout Format Guide)

- 1. On the LEFT side of your layout: Define Contrast
- 2. **Research Photographers** who have used a high contrast visual element in their works. Print an example of at least two of their works. Write several sentences describing what interests you about the work and the photographer's approach.
- 3. Leave a space for a reflection on this page.
- 3. **Now it's your turn.** Using the work you researched as inspiration photograph the people, architecture and natural environment around you. Consider the <u>"RULE OF THIRDS"</u> when taking your photos. Focus on the design principle of **CONTRAST**. These images should be in a limited range of value. You should be working with the idea of intense light and shadows. All resulting photo's must be in black and white. You may change the colors of your image with an App or photo editing software. Consider taking photos that you will use in your exhibition that follow a cohesive theme you may want to explore.
- 4. **On the RIGHT side** of your layout, print and glue your favorite three images. Describe your use of contrast in each photo. Explain what interested you about the subject. Describe the feelings you are wish to convey with each image?
- 5. Upload your best photos into the artwork folder in your Google Drive.









Small Object: Bring this Object in during the first week of School!

In order to help explore different art making mediums in a short amount of time, you will be working on 25 versions of a single object.

Consider carefully what this object will be. This object should be small enough to fit in an art drawer. Pick something that is interesting to you as you will be drawing and painting this object many, many times. Choose something with varied contours and texture. Nothing perishable, perfectly smooth or that can easily fall apart.




