- · SPC 1608 Speech Communication
- · HUM 2020 Experiencing the Humanities
- · AMH 2020 US History 1865-Present

Embedded tutors and librarians will help introduce the students to the resources available at the College.

- · Submit the Interest Form.
- Submit an Application for Admission for an A.A. degree for Summer Term 2022 and be accepted to Seminole State.
- · Be classified as an in-state Florida resident.
- · Complete the First-Time-In-College Students Steps to Enroll.
- Submit a 2021-22 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
