



6th Grade Gifted/Advanced Language Arts Syllabus
Mrs. Swenson
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Welcome to 6th grade Language Arts! Language Arts teachers work closely together to immerse students in the Florida Standards, including the areas of literature, informational text, writing, speaking & listening, and language.

Middle School Language Arts is the forum for students to explore and understand the past, present, and future through literature and writing. This course enables students to study the elements of language arts through short stories, nonfiction, drama, poetry, novels, and various writing units. Student voices will not only be heard through discussions about text, but through writing as well. Emphasis will be placed on independent and higher level thinking skills and responding to text through writing. The goal of the middle school language arts program is to develop lifelong readers and writers who can successfully communicate in our global society.

Supplies: Students are also expected to have: **one composition book, one plastic pocket folder, paper, pencils, glue sticks and ear buds** with them in class every day. Other items they should have include: highlighters, colored pencils, post-it notes. Because there are days that I integrate technology in my classroom, **it is recommended that students have an iPad/tablet or smart phone that they can bring to school with them on a daily basis**, though it is **not** mandatory. Students will know at the start of class each day if it is a day when they should have their device out, or if it is a “no device” day. **Students should be respectful and keep their device in their backpack if it is a “no device” day.** Students should keep a book with them at ALL times for designated silent reading time or in the event that work is completed early. If students don't know what they should read, I can provide book suggestions.

Grading: Language Arts will be graded using a points system. All assignments will be divided into two categories: assignments or assessments. Everything is weighted the same, although the points for assignments will vary, depending upon the assignment, its difficulty and its correlation to the focus standard. For example, a homework assignment may be worth 10 points, while an essay is worth 30 points. The point value assigned to each assignment will determine the cumulative grade each grading period and may be changed at any time, at the teacher's discretion. Please refer to the MyStudent gradebook to track student grades and assignments.

Assignments: The assignments category will include classwork and homework.

Classwork: Students will keep an Interactive Notebook. Most of their classwork will be completed in this notebook. Periodically it will be collected for grading. Some entries will be graded for completion and participation, while most will be graded for mastery of standards. In addition, students will have assignments that are completed outside of their Interactive Notebook and turned in separately. These assignments could be completed individually, with a partner, or as a group.

Homework: Students will be expected to read for at least 30 minutes each evening. In addition to reading, students can expect to have homework **up to four times a week** in Language Arts. HW could include reading, written assignments, reviewing notes, online practice, and/or studying or completing work not finished in class. Please check MyStudent each night for homework assignments. Students are responsible for keeping up with and recording their homework assignments.

Assessments: Students will have assessments throughout the year to determine their proficiency level of a concept. These could take a variety of formats, like performance task, short response, essay, multiple choice, project, etc. Throughout the year, students will be given writing assignments and projects. These will be assigned in advance, so that there is ample time to complete it to the best of their ability. As they are assigned, information will be posted on myStudent and given to each student. Some assessments may require students to submit their response electronically using one of our District's web sites or accounts (myLearning, Office 365, etc.). In addition, Quarterly Checks are given at the end of each quarter and will count for 2% of the overall grade. Assessments will usually be an opportunity for students to show what they know by applying what they've learned in class.

Late Work: Students are expected to have their work in on time. Late work will be penalized with a reduction of points.

Make-Up Work: Students who are absent will have two days per day of *excused* absence to complete their work. Please note that any work assigned prior to an absence is not considered make-up work and is due at the start of class upon the student's return. It is the student's responsibility to check a partner's interactive notebook and the absent work bin upon their return.

Grade Scale: A=90%-100% , B=80%-89% , C=70%-79% , D=60%-69% = D, F=below 60%

Online Programs

Students will be required to have online access to complete their assignments each week. They can access the web from home, the local library or before/after school at CSRMS.

Single Sign On-All of the programs listed below may be accessed through Single-Sign On: Click on <https://launchpad.classlink.com/dsbpc> and sign on. The user name is the student's lunch number and the password is their usual 8-digit password (funky password) Once logged in, students can access the programs with one click, instead of having to go into each program and signing into each one.

MyLearning (Canvas) – This is a Pasco County site that requires a log in. Students will be given their login information to keep in their interactive notebook or they can access it through Single Sign-On. I use this site to post information for students. In addition, students will participate in discussions, quizzes and turn assignments in. Parents can create an account to monitor their student's activity on MyLearning.

Office 365 - Office 365 will allow students to type something at school (text document or slideshow) without needing a USB drive to save it. Students can also access their account from anywhere with Internet access. Students will be provided an account through Pasco County. Their login information will be in their Interactive Notebook and on Single Sign-On. Students will also have access to a school-based e-mail account.

Online Textbook – <https://my.hrw.com> Students will have access to their online textbook at home through any Internet connection. They will not be issued a traditional textbook. Students will have their login information in their Interactive Notebook and on Single Sign-On. Students can read, listen to, or annotate text that we use in class. Students may also turn in written assignments online using *Writable* via the textbook.
