Dear Pauoa Ohana,

2023 is flying by very quickly. I am so blessed with the partnership that we have with the home and school. Thank you families for your continued support with working with your child at home and providing them the space to learn and grow. I am appreciative for your efforts in checking their planner, signing it acknowledging that your child completed his/her homework for the day, and making sure your child accesses iReady each week. Please make sure that your child completes 45 minutes per week or more if on grade level (green), 60 minutes per week or more if less than one grade level behind (yellow) and 75 minutes or more if more than one grade level behind (red).

February brings much love and blessings to our school and families with Valentine's Day and President's Day (no school, Feb. 20). We are working on kindness in our school as our students came to know how to be a bucket filler during our SEL classes. Our students are aware of looking for kindness in and around the classroom/school as they can nominate a kind act they witnessed and fill their class bucket or buckets around our campus like the office, cafeteria and library. Have a conversation with your child about how they are being a bucket filler at Pauoa.

Lastly, February also means kindergarten registration. If you know of a child who will turn 5 by July 31st of this year, remind them to register their child at Pauoa. If they do not reside in our district, they will need to apply for a Geographic Exception. Forms are online or at our school office. In order to register, you will need to provide some documents such as a rental agreement and utility bill in order to register your child. See our website for more information. Have a blessed month.

As Valentine's Day approaches, please remember that due to safety protocols, food treats must be store-bought for distribution.

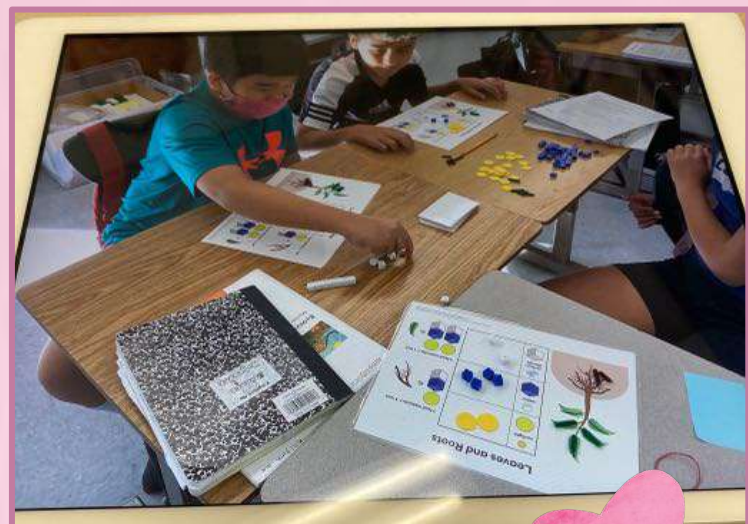

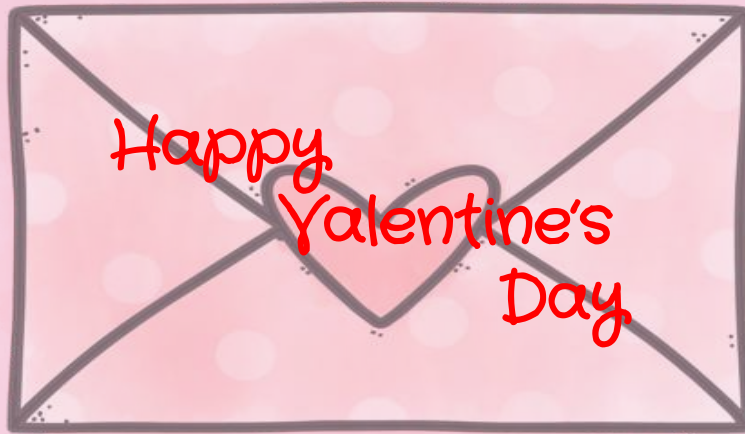

RESIDENTIAL MATERIALS ONLY. PLEASE. NO COMMERCIAL OR GOVERNMENT DROP-OFFS.

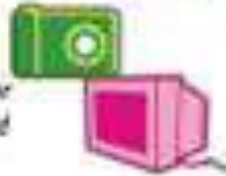
SCRAP METALS

YES: All types of scrap metal including bicycles, washers, dryers, fencing, filing cabinets, etc.
NO: Refrigerators, AC units, any compressed gas cylinders, or microwaves



ELECTRONICS

YES: AITVs, computers, printers, scanners, monitors, large toner cartridges, laptops, game systems, cameras, cell phones, cables and cords.
NO: Smart boards, microwaves, fans, vacuums, blenders, large printer & copier machines, or multiple loads (please limit your donations to one small truckload, one TV and bag of toner cartridges per dropoff)



CONFIDENTIAL DOCUMENTS

YES: Documents for shredding. Collected in locked bins and shredded off-site. (Limit 2 boxes of paper per car)
NO: Newspapers, glossy magazines, other types of paper



HOUSEHOLD GOODS

YES: New and gently used clothing, shoes, accessories, books, DVDs, CDs, kitchen items, toys, and games
NO: Mattresses; soiled, moldy, or broken materials; baby equipment (strollers, car seats, high chairs, etc.)



COOKING OILS

YES: Used household cooking oil in sealed containers (up to 2 gallons per vehicle)
NO: Motor oil or leaking containers, no restaurant oil



HI-5 ALUMINUM CANS, PLASTIC & GLASS BOTTLES

YES: Only HI-5 containers; remove caps and excess liquid
NO: General recycling including cardboard, #1 & #2 non-beverage plastic containers, glass jugs, wine bottles, metal food cans



Proceeds from scrap metals, used cooking oil and HI-5 beverage cans and bottles will go directly to the host school.

Kindergarten Registration Begins Feb. 1st Do you have a sibling who will turn age 5 by July 31, 2023. If you reside in the Pauoa district you may begin to register for Kindergarten beginning February 1, 2023. If you live outside of our district, please make sure to follow the GE process and submit to your home school between (Jan 03 - March 01, 2023).

GE Information

Geographic Exception SY 2023-2024. If you know a family who is interested in enrolling at Pauoa Elementary but resides outside our school boundary or if you are interested in enrolling your child to a school outside his/her home school boundary, the GE Application form must be completed and submitted to the home school (for new students) or current school for students who are already enrolled and plan to change to another DOE school. (e.g. for middle school)

If you are currently on a GE at Pauoa you do NOT need to re-apply each year.

(The home school serves the geographic area of the child's residence.)

GE applications for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year shall be submitted between January 3 and March 1 2023 to facilitate a decision before the end of the school year.

- Don't forget to include with your GE application: SASE (Self Addressed Stamped Envelope)
- Proof of residency document (e.g. Utility bill)
