

Thank you for attending the Parent-Teacher Conference! It was so nice to meet and talk with you. Your constant support at home will help your child be successful in second grade.

#### How to support your child at home:

- Please help us in having your child complete their homework each day. Check their planners daily.
- Grade 2 teachers aim to have your child complete as much i-Ready at school. However, students can also complete i-Ready at home. Your child <u>needs at least a total of 50-minutes for both Reading and</u> <u>Math.</u> The more minutes on i-Ready the better.
- Reading Fluency & Comprehension Homework <u>TIME your child while he/she reads for 1</u>
   <u>MINUTE</u> and <u>count the number of words read correctly</u>. Also <u>ask and answer comprehension</u> <u>questions</u> to <u>check for understanding</u> in the story/text.
- Have your child read everyday for at least 20 minutes. This helps to build reading fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, and spelling skills.
- • Spend at least 5-minutes daily to practice memorizing addition and subtraction facts to 20.
