
Aloha B7 Families,



The Micro:Bit is a simple microprocessing device for our students to practice hands-on hardware coding and digital making. They will explore a variety of projects, including the Magic Eight Ball, Jen-Ken-Pon Teams, and Fireflies. These projects are designed to help them move to the next step in their programming understanding by having them control discreet input-output ports on their device. Our 4th grade students will also be moving to hardware programming with our Lego robotics. For these classes, we will be focusing on solid construction and stable programming to complete challenging tasks. In the 4th quarter, our goal is to bring 4th and 5th grade programming classes into the real world.






Withdrawal / Transfer Request
