Goodbye January and hello February. I am so blessed with the partnership that we have with the home and school. Thank you families for your continued support with working with your child at home and providing them the space to learn and grow. I am appreciative of your efforts in checking their planner, signing it acknowledging that your child completed his/her homework for the day, and making sure your child accesses iReady each week. Please make sure that your child completes 45 minutes per week or more if on grade level (green), 60 minutes per week or more if less than one grade level behind (yellow) and 75 minutes or more if more than one grade level behind (red). Today's work that your child does today is so different from when we were in school, especially in math. It's like comparing apples to oranges. No comparison. It is okay to just let your child go, in fact, have them teach you and just listen to them as they make sense of the new skills he/she is learning in order for them to apply the learning.

February brings us fitness and love as we have our Pauoa Fitness Challenge on February 23 and Valentine's Day. Try and find time to add fitness to your schedule. Maybe a walk in the park or around the block. For those of you who live in apartment buildings, then use the stairs once a day or walk up and down the stairs for 10 minutes in the day. 

Did you know that the color of your urine and the way your bowel movement looks, are big signs to what is happening in your body?

Remember the four S's: SHAPE, SIZE, SMELL, SHADE.

Pale urine "pee, shi-shi, number one" means you're drinking plenty of water, and possibly using the toilet often. The more transparent/clear, the better. Keep it up!

A healthy bowel movement "poop, doo-doo, number two" should look like a torpedo, and easy to pass while on the toilet. Brown is normal, and do it at least once a day. Hydrate often!

Please teach your kin to look at what they made it the toilet, and communicate what's happening to their body.

Wai (water) can be safely accessed throughout our campus. Practice using your hands to serve as a vise to drink.

GE Information

Geographic Exception SY 2024-2025. If you know a family who is interested in enrolling at Pauoa Elementary but resides outside our school boundary or if you are interested in enrolling your child to a school outside his/her home school boundary, the GE Application form must be completed and submitted to the home school (for new students) or current school for students who are already enrolled and plan to change to another DOE school. (e.g. for middle school). If you are currently on a GE at Pauoa you do NOT need to re-apply each year. (The home school serves the geographic area of the child's residence.) GE applications for the upcoming 2024-2025 school year shall be submitted between January 2 and March 1 2024 to facilitate a decision before the end of the school year.

- Don't forget to include with your GE application: SASE (Self Addressed Stamped Envelope)
- Proof of residency document (e.g. Utility bill)


