School Breakfast Program Outreach

School breakfast continues to be a focus of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and within the state of Delaware. The Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, PL 111-296, establishes requirements for conducting outreach in the School Breakfast Program (SBP).

At the beginning of each school year, or when the SBP resumes for School Year (SY) 2022-2023, School Food Authorities (SFAs) must inform families of the availability of the SBP. This information can be provided in many ways including: weekly announcements to students; menus posted in the office; menus sent home with back-to-school paperwork; menus posted on the SFA website; emails or automated calls to families; and social media posts. This requirement is reviewed during an Administrative Review.

As a reminder, House Bill 408 went into effect SY 2017-2018. The bill is stated below:

Beginning in school year 2017-2018, every public school site, including charter school sites, participating in the Community Eligibility Provision, shall be required to offer a breakfast at no cost to every student in the school through an Alternative Service Model, which may be in addition to their traditional breakfast meal service.
