Course Description/Student Achievement Targets:

African American Studies is an elective course that will serve to teach student about contributions made by individual African-Americans in government, the arts, humanities, and science. The students will examine African-American participation in the development of the United States and Africa, African-American pursuit of equal treatment under the laws. Major topics of this course are slavery and Reconstruction, the Harlem Renaissance, Civil Rights Movement, African-American Literature, Education and African Americans, social issues and African-Americans in the 21st Century. This course is for juniors and seniors

Student Expectations and Achievement

The high school Ethnic-African American course provides students with a comprehensive, intensive study of major events and themes in Ethnic-African American history. Beginning with Ancient African history, the course examines major events and themes throughout history. The course concludes with significant developments in the early 21st century. Mastery of the Georgia Performance Standards will be expected of all students. Mastery is defined as achieving a minimum of 90% of the course content. Mastery of those standards should be evident with an 'Exceeds' score on the SLO for Ethnic-African American studies.

Unit repair policy

In an effort to aid in student mastery, each UGHS student will have the opportunity to participate in Unit Repair if he/she makes a 69 or lower on a unit assessment (as defined by the teacher). This opportunity will only be extended during the first semester (August – December) of school. In order to receive this opportunity, the student must communicate with the teacher to receive instructions within two school days of receiving the graded assessment. Students will be required to complete coursework and/or before/afterschool tutoring as defined by the teacher to show a greater understanding of the material to reassess. The student has 2 weeks from the date the graded test is returned to complete the practice work and take the reassessment. Students will receive an average score of the first and second assessment for their final assessment grade.

Classroom Rules and Expectations

- Adhere to all rules and regulations in the handbook
- All assignments are expected to exhibit your best work and turned in on time.
- Food and drink, except water, are not allowed in my classroom.
