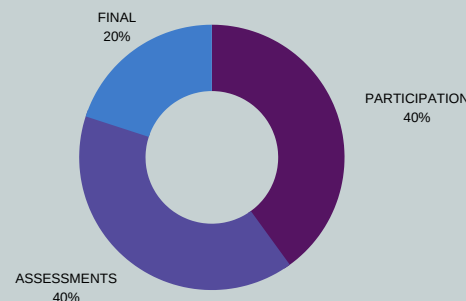

CLASSROOM RULES



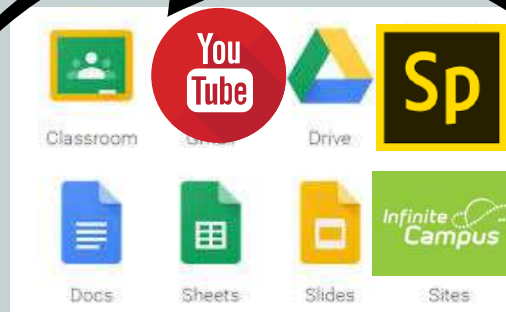
