Course Description

Introduction to Healthcare Science is the foundational course for all Health Science pathways and is a prerequisite for all other Healthcare Science pathway courses. This course will enable students to receive initial exposure to the many Healthcare Science careers as well as employability, communication, and technology skills necessary in the healthcare industry. The concepts of human growth and development, interaction with patients and family members, health, wellness, and preventative care are evaluated, as well as the legal, ethical responsibilities of today's healthcare provider. Fundamental healthcare skills development is initiated including microbiology, basic life support and first aid. This course will provide students with a competitive edge to be the better candidate for either entry into the healthcare global marketplace and/or the post-secondary institution of their choice to continue their education and training. The pre-requisite for this course is advisor approval.

Major Course Goals/Objectives

*During the CPR unit of the course, students will have the option to purchase a CPR card upon successful completion of the CPR course test and evaluation. Card cost will be announced. This is an added perk for the students and is not required for course completion.

Attendance Requirements/Make-up work

Excused Absences:

If a student must be absent, it is the student's responsibility, to make arrangements for make-up work. Students should check with teacher before or after class for any missed assignments on the first day they return to school. The number of days allowed to complete make-up work will not exceed the number of days absent. Failure to comply with this procedure will result in a grade of zero (0) being given for graded assignments missed during an excused absence.

Unexcused absences:

Students will not be allowed to make up graded assignments missed during an unexcused absence. Absences due to suspension from school are considered unexcused. Students assigned to In-School Suspension who choose to serve their suspension at home will not be given the opportunity to make up work missed during the period of suspension. Students are allowed to make up schoolwork missed while suspended from school pending their disciplinary hearing. In situations where students are suspended from school during the period of semester exams, principals will make arrangements to allow students to complete their exams. In situations where Out of School Suspension is assigned, the ability to make-up any missed work is at the teacher's discretion.

Policy on Tardies

Students are expected to be in class on time as listed on the bell schedule. Students who are late to class will be subject to detention. Please refer to ELHS Tardy to Class Policy.
