- 9. The parishioners speculate about Mr. Hooper's reasons for wearing the veil. What are some of those reasons?
- 10. In one afternoon, the minister presides at both a funeral and a wedding. How do the people react to the presence of the veil at each event?
- 11. How does Hooper explain the wearing of the veil to Elizabeth?
- 12. What arguments against his wearing the veil does she make?
- 13. How does Elizabeth's attitude about the veil change over the course of the story?
- 14. What are the tone and atmosphere of the story? Cite several words or phrases that suggest each.
- 15. What is the reason that Mr. Hooper gives for wearing the veil? (p. 307)
