Back in Action

REYNOLDS RAP

In last week's Ram Report, I told parents that student scores on the first FAST assessment of the year would be available on the Florida Department of Education Parent Portal. I was premature in making this announcement. Scores won't be available on the Parent Portal until late October. However, scores have been added to Skyward, and all parents will be receiving an email from SCPS about how to access those scores. Parents should understand that this first FAST assessment is a baseline score, so it may be lower than you expect. Students will show growth between now and the January and May FAST assessments. For current 9th and 10th graders, a proficient score on FAST, or a concordant score on SAT or ACT, will be required for graduation. For current 11th and 12th graders, a proficient score on FSA, or a concordant score on SAT or ACT, is required for graduation. Please read the Testing Update in this newsletter to stay informed about testing requirements.

September 15th marked the first day of Hispanic Heritage Month. Did you know that 28% of LMHS students are of Hispanic heritage? This month is a great time to celebrate the cultures of our diverse population and share the knowledge of various student backgrounds that help us secure a school culture of acceptance and understanding.

Testing Information

Save the Date

- The PSAT will be given to all 9th-11th grade students on Wednesday, October 12 during the school day.
- The SAT will be given to all 12th grade students on Wednesday, October 12 during the school day. Students can set up a College Board account at www.collegeboard.org and can link their account to Khan Academy where they have access to official SAT practice items.
- The ACT will be given to all 11th grade students on Tuesday, November 1 and Tuesday, March 28 during the school day.
- The SAT will be given to all 11th grade students on Wednesday, March 1 during the school day.
- Students will not need to register for these assessments and there will be no charge. More information will be sent out closer to the testing dates.

FSA ELA Writing/Reading Retakes

11th and 12th grade students who have not yet met the reading graduation requirement will be scheduled to take the FSA ELA Writing and Reading Retakes. This week, students and parents will receive an email with testing date and location information (if your student has not yet met this requirement).

If any students who are new to Lake Mary High School have concordant SAT (SAT ERW score of 480+) or ACT (average of 18 on English and Reading Subtests) scores, please email kathleen_aslin@scps.us with the score report.

Algebra 1 EOC Math Graduation Requirement

Students may utilize any of the following options to meet the Math high school graduation requirement:

- Earn a level 3 (score of 497) on the Algebra 1 EOC or
- Earn a level 3 (score of 499) on the Geometry EOC score or
- Earn/use a comparative score on one of the following assessments:
 - PSAT/NMSQT Math Score of 430+
 - SAT Math Score of 420+
 - ACT Math Score of 16+

Parent Corner

This section contains important information for parents. Please read to stay informed!

Rams Period

This year, we changed our bell schedule and built in a Rams Period, which is a 30 minute period held every Wednesday where teachers deliver important information not related to a specific subject area. For example, the Florida Department of Education requires all students to engage in a series of mental health lessons. We are using Rams Period to deliver these lessons. Students will also take the many surveys required throughout the school year during this time, and on some days, teachers conduct check-ins with students or share information from our Student Services department. What's important for parents to know is that all students **MUST** attend their Rams Period, because many of the activities are **REQUIRED** for all students. Even seniors who do not have class on campus 6th and 7th periods must attend their Rams Period before leaving. Students who skip their Rams Period will be referred to the discipline office. We sincerely appreciate your support and understanding that this 30-minute time period, offered once per week, is important!

Student Driving

Parents of student drivers, we need your help! Many of our students are driving very carelessly on the way into campus in the morning, as well as in the parking lot. Just last week, we had 3 accidents in the parking lot. On a daily basis, we receive reports of students driving down the center lane of Longwood-Lake Mary Rd, which is very dangerous. If you have a student driver, please talk to him or her about safe driving. We don't want anyone getting hurt, and for students found driving in an unsafe manner, we will revoke your parking pass.

Parent Dropoff

For parents who drop off children in the morning, we prefer that you use the main entrance. but we know some drop off at the side of the school. For parents who drop off on the south side, please do not park in that lot - it's a staff lot, and it fills up every day. Also, please do not drive down by the bus ramp on that side. We need to keep both bus ramps clear during dropoff. Thank you for your assistance!

Absence Reporting

Parents, this is a friendly reminder that credit denial is in place this year for any students who post 10 unexcused absences in a semester. Parents have 5 days after an absence to either drop off an excused note to our Attendance Office or email it to lmhs_attendance@scps.us.


Cap and Gown Orders
