Nebo Elementary's **vision** is to work with our learning community members and our local community members to ensure our students are engaged in a quality educational experience that is provided in a safe, productive environment as they prepare to become contributing lifelong learners in our local and global community.

Nebo Elementary's **mission** is to engage in learning.

Nebo Elementary Goals

- Nebo Elementary will increase student Lexile growth as measured by the 3-5 grade Reading Inventory Assessment from August 2020 to May 2021 obtaining a school-wide average of 200L growth points.
- Nebo Elementary will increase student Quantile growth as measured by the 1-5 grades Math Inventory Assessment from August 2020 to May 2021 obtaining a school-wide average of 145 Q growth points.
- Nebo Elementary will decrease the percentage of student major behavior referrals from August 2019 to March 2020 compared to August 2020 to May 2021.

Paulding County School District Goals

- During the 2020-2021, PCSD will prepare students to increase the percent of students scoring proficient in Math, Science, ELA and Social Studies by 3% on Georgia Milestones in 2021-2022.
- During 2020-21, PCSD will prepare students to increase the performance of subgroups (SWD, EL, ED) in ELA by 3% on Georgia Milestones in 2021-22.
- During 2020-2021, PCSD will reduce the percentage of subgroups (SWD, EL, ED) assigned to OSS and ISS by 3% as reported in the student information system.

Teachers, Parents, and Students – Together for Success

In the Third Grade Classroom

The 3rd Grade team will work with students and their families in partnership for student success in Reading and Math. We will work with families to support students in the following ways:

- ✓ Provide parents with addition/subtraction and multiplication/division flashcards with suggested activities throughout the year for students to work on nightly along with any other needs based differentiated activity based on data.
- ✓ Provide books on child's reading level and comprehension questions for parents to ask their child nightly before, during, and after reading a text.
- ✓ Encourage parents to attend monthly parent meetings and family learning nights.
- ✓ Encourage parents to check out resources using electronic checkout on website from PRC and to attend monthly parent meetings and family learning nights

Nebo Elementary Students

Nebo students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and help row in the right direction towards success in Reading and Math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- ✓ Practice multiplication fact fluency using my flashcards for 5 minutes each night.
- ✓ Read to an adult for 20 minutes each night and answer the comprehension questions they ask. I will prove my answers with support from the text.
- ✓ Encourage my parents to check out games and materials from the PRC using the Microsoft form on Nebo's Title I website to support learning at home. Remind them about monthly parent meetings and family learning nights, and schedule meetings throughout the year with the teacher and/or the Title 1 ILT to understand curriculum and learn concepts when needed.
- ✓ Share my homework tasks with my family each night.

At Home

Nebo School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in Reading and Math:

- ✓ Help my child practice multiplication math facts for 5 minutes each night.
- ✓ Ask my child comprehension questions after he/she has read for 20 minutes.
- ✓ Try to attend monthly parent meetings and family learning nights.
- ✓ Check email to ensure my child is on target and I will support my child with their homework.
