Assignment Overview – Traditional vs Non-traditional Careers

1. Start researching/identifying traditional and non-traditional careers
2. Gather information on the following:
 - Traditional Information Technology (IT) careers
 - A new technology career that has been created due to emerging technology
 - A long-standing career in which technology has impacted the work force
3. Once information is gathered, create a professional assignment of choice to showcase understanding of standard / assignment

What is the definition of a non-traditional career?

Working in a field or pursuing a degree program in which the total population is comprised of 25% or less of one gender.

Why choose the non-traditional career path?

- Opportunities for more advancement and job satisfaction
- Alternative path to economic independence
