• How high or low a pitch is

Melody

- A series of pitches that create a musical idea

Harmony

- 2 or more pitches sounding at the same time to create a chord or progression

- Terms used for harmony:
 - Major
 - Minor
 - Consonant
 - dissonant

Texture

• The way the harmony and melody go together

- Terms used to describe texture
 - <u>Solo</u>
 - <u>Homophonic</u>
 - Polyphonic
 - <u>Thin</u>
 - <u>Dense</u>

Dynamics

- How loud or soft music is
 - Describe the dynamics in this scene

 - Soft, medium, loud
 - Crescendo
 - Decrescendo

Rhythm

- Sounds of different lengths are organized into patterns
 - Describe the rhythm in the scene

 - Steady, syncopated
 - Beat

Tempo

- The speed of the beat in music

The quality of a musical sound made by instruments or voices
