Economic Foreign Aid



- Help develop economy
- Food, Clothing, Shelter
- Infrastructure development
- Medical Aid

Military Aid



- Money to purchase
- Weapons, Training and Equipment

Military Intervention



- Acts of War
- Blockade
- Direct support/assistance
- Invasion

Humanitarian Aid



- Natural or man-made disasters
- Support of the people not their government
- Relieve suffering

Economic Sanctions



- Stopping/Limiting Trade with U.S. others
- Brings suffering within the other country

Executive Agreement

- Formal Agreement between US President and another country's Head of State
- Becomes Legally Binding, unless rescinded by a new U.S. President



Treaties

- Formal Agreement between US and another country
- Approved by Senate Agreement becomes US Law
