**Course Description**: Welcome historians to US History! I look forward to working with you this semester. The high school US History course covers major events in United States History. The course begins with European colonization and chronologically exams key events and themes through the early 21<sup>st</sup> century.

**Required textbook**: This will be in the form distributed handouts, PowerPoints, Lecture, and videos.

Required Materials: Bring these items to class daily.

- Lined paper either loose leaf or spiral notebook
- Pens / Pencils
- Plan blank paper for activities/projects
- Access to markers or colored pencils
- Access to the internet
- Fully charged computer with working audio and camera. (if any of these do not work properly it is your responsibility to get with IT at school to get it fixed. Chromebooks will be required for ALL tests and quizzes. No personal computers.
- HIGHLY recommend a notebook or folder that is organized by each unit. We will cover this in class the first week.

**In-class assignments**: Students will be required to complete in-class activities and assignments in a timely manner. This includes activities tests, quizzes, group projects, working in breakout rooms, working on a reading handout, or doing some assigned activity. Occasionally, time will be provided in class to complete assignments. Anything not completed in class is considered homework. Some in class assignments are due by the end of class as a due date such as exit tickets for example.

\*\*Warm-ups are due within the first 15 minutes of class and not credit (if assigned) will be given for warm-ups turned in at the end of the class or after.

**Out of Class assignments:** Out of class assignments include but are not limited to, readings, writing activities, research projects, and/or oral, audio, or visual presentations.

**Absences and tardiness:** Students are expected to attend ALL classes and be prepared to discuss topics daily. This means having all materials, notes, access to textbook or handouts, pen and paper, signed in on time and ready to participate. However, it is understood that from time to time there may be a valid reason for missed classes such as a doctor's appointment or school-related activity. In this case, it is the student's responsibility to contact the teacher for any missed work. Please refer to the Impact Academy/Henry County Schools Student Handbook explaining tardiness and absences. Excessive absences will hinder your success.

**Missed work:** <u>Assignments are due on the assigned due date listed in Google Classroom.</u> Assignments turned in after the due date receive an automatic 10-point reduction from the evaluation of the assignment within the first 1-5 days and 20-point reduction thereafter. No assignments will be accepted after the start of a new unit (typically two weeks). Exceptions only for valid, documented communication between the student and teacher for reasons of illness or hospital, for example. (Note: communication does not mean at the end of the semester). This is separate from remediation or resubmission which can be completed with evidence of conversation with the teacher and by demonstration of applying feedback, re-reading as necessary, or other suggestions provided by the teacher. The goal is to complete tasks on time while also gaining an understanding of the material.

**Make-up Work:** Students are responsible for contacting the teacher and getting any missed assignments. Students that need to make up a test or presentation need to communicate this to the teacher upon the first day returning to school to schedule the make-up. Please refer to Henry County Schools Student Handbook. (See also missed work policy).
