Verbos Reflexivos

Reflexive verbs are used to indicate that the subject is both the giver and the receiver of the action.

Example: The boy dresses himself.




Who is dressing?


Is that same person **receiving** the dressing? (Yes!)

Since the boy is both **doing** the dressing **and receiving** the dressing, it is **reflexive**.


Verbos Reflexivos


have two parts: a reflexive pronoun and an infinitive verb.

reflexive pronoun

In English the **reflexive** pronouns are often expressed with a "self/selves" ending:

You shower **yourself**.

The boys wash themselves.

Sometimes the "self/selves" sounds *strange* in English, so we omit it...

She brushes (herself).




Remember, though, if she is both doing the brushing and receiving the brushing, it is a reflexive verb. The following are the reflexive pronouns in English: The Spanish equivalents are as follows:

myself = me	ourselves = nos
yourself = te	yourselves = os
Yourself = se	yourselves = se
himself = se	themselves = se themselves = se
herself = se	themselves = se


Now that we have the reflexive pronouns, we need to conjugate the verb (in the present tense). You conjugate the verb to go along with who is doing AND receiving the action.

I am washing myself.




