Does your child ride the school bus? We have put a new, more organized and timely procedure in place to dismiss students that ride buses. Our school day ends at 2:50. Students line up in their houses by bus number. Kindergarten students are loaded first. Each bus is called and students are supervised as they walk out. All of our buses are safely loaded and out of our lot by 2:57. One exception is with bus 174 that does not usually arrive at Hickory until that time. We have amazing bus drivers who get students to and from school safely each day. They do a great job of controlling a large bus while also managing the behavior of 70+ students that are aboard. Please help out the driver (and me) by reiterating some important bus rules that your child should follow each and every day:

- 1. Follow the driver's directions the first time.
- 2. Stay in your seat, face the front of the bus, and **BUCKLE UP**.
- 3. Keep your hands, feet, and objects to yourself and inside the bus.
- 4. Use voices that can only be heard by those sitting close to you.
- 5. Do not eat, drink, or chew gum unless permitted by the bus driver.

Thank you for your help with your bus rider! We are looking forward to the week ahead which will involve Student Council elections, field trips, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade Veterans assembly, and the Variety Show (just to name a few of our activities)! Enjoy the week! All the best,

We have many daytime events happening at HCES! When visiting the school during the day, ANY GUEST should be an approved volunteer. Please access <u>https://stjohns.keepntrack.com/apply/</u> to apply to be an "approved volunteer.

When coming to visit, please stop by the front desk and sign in to our Keep'n'Track system. You will need to be prepared to present your ID to whomever is working at the front desk for verification. Please wear your visitor badge whenever you are in the building to alert our employees that you have clearance to be in the building.

If you are looking to check your child out early, or pick them up in the event they are ill, please be prepared to show your identification. It is not always the same person working at the front desk, and our staff has been instructed to verify authorization before releasing a student to an adult.

If a student comes to the front office before 3:15 to retrieve an item, the front office staff will call to make sure the teacher is in the room before letting the student back in the building. If the teacher is not in the room, or if it is after 3:15, that item will have to wait to be retrieved the next school day.
