Western Europe

- -Countries in Western Europe: France, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Switzerland, Austria
- -France and Germany: two most dominant countries in Western Europe
- -Strong economies due to access of ports, trade routes, and natural resources



-Benelux: economic union of the countries of Belgium, Netherlands, and Luxemborg

History of Western Europe

- -Reformation: time period in early 1500s when many Catholics broke away from the church and formed Protestant churches
- -Started with Martin Luther, a German monk who was unhappy with the teachings of the Catholic Church
- -Published his "95 Theses": 95 things that the Catholic Church did/taught that he disagreed with

History of Western Europe

-<u>nationalism</u>: belief that people should be loyal to their nation

-This belief led to many wars between countries in Western Europe from the 1600s-1800s

Economy of Western Europe

- -Belgium, Switzerland, France, and the Netherlands are strong in livestock and dairy farming
- -France is the largest producer of agricultural products in Western Europe
- -Major crops: wheat, grapes, and vegetables

Economy of Western Europe

- -Western Europe is a very popular tourist area
- -Especially France (Paris, French Riviera), Switzerland (Swiss Alps)
- -Western Europe is also a producer of luxury goods: expensive cars, watches



Culture and Modern Society of Western Europe

- -Western Europe produced many great classical composers
- -Germany: Johann Sebastian Bach, Ludwig van Beethoven
 - -Austria: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart
- -Many Western European cities have excellent public transportation systems
 - -Paris Métro, Berlin U-Bahn

Culture and Modern Society of Western Europe

-Many Western European countries receive *much* more paid vacation than the United States

-Germany: about 20 paid vacation days per year

-Austria: 5 weeks!
