



Image: the circuitry of a motherboard

- Selection comes from three curriculum areas and one Core

- Passing scores are required on all exams to receive Diploma

English General Paper ~ 9th Grade (8021)

What is English General Paper?

• The Cambridge International AS Level English General Paper course encourages you to think critically about a wide variety of modern issues as a means of developing your skills in reading and writing. It also seeks to strengthen your ability to communicate in English.

Topics Covered

- Economic, historical, moral, political, and social
- Science, including its history, philosophy, ethics, general principles and applications; environment issues; technology and mathematics
- Literature, language, the arts, crafts and the media.

Why English General Paper?

 The skills practiced in this course are required at the university level, valued in the professional world, and necessary for citizens living in 21st-century society.

Global Perspectives ~9th Grade Social Studies (9239)

What is Global Perspectives?

A **skills based course** that enables students to explore and make judgments about **global issues** of relevance and importance to their lives through a variety of different lens (**perspectives**). This course encourages the development within young people of global competency – the ability to define a global problem, reflect and take action.

Students will:

-explore issues of global significance -acquire, develop and apply skills in:

Critical thinking
Problem solving
Research
Communication
Collaboration

Possible Topics Explored:

Artificial Intelligence, Arts in an international context, Changing national identities, Cultural heritage, Endangered cultures, Ethical foreign policies, Gender issues, Impact of the internet, International law, International sport, Medical ethics and priorities, Political systems, Rise of global superpowers, Standard of living/quality of life, Technology and lifestyles, Tourism, Urbanisation

Themes/Perspectives:

Culture, economics, environment, ethics, politics, science, technology

10th Grade English Language (9093)

Cambridge International AS Level English Language develops a set of transferable skills. These include critical analysis; constructing arguments; presenting knowledge and understanding; and writing English in a balanced, articulate and fluent manner.

Learners can apply these skills across a wide range of subjects and real-world situations. These skills will also equip them well for progression to higher education.

The aims are to enable students to:

- enjoy the experience of studying the English language
- develop a critical and informed response to texts in a range of forms, styles and contexts, produced for a variety of audiences
- communicate effectively, creatively, accurately and appropriately in their writing
- develop the interdependent skills of reading, analysis and research
- develop an appreciation of concepts and techniques in the study of English language
- build a firm foundation for further study of language and linguistics
