






#### Languages studied in US 2000






#### Languages studied in US- 2000






#### Languages studied in US except Spanish- 2000






#### French and all languages except Spanish- 2000






#### 2006 SAT I Students by language






#### **SAT I Verbal scores**





#### SAT I Verbal Scores- 2006




