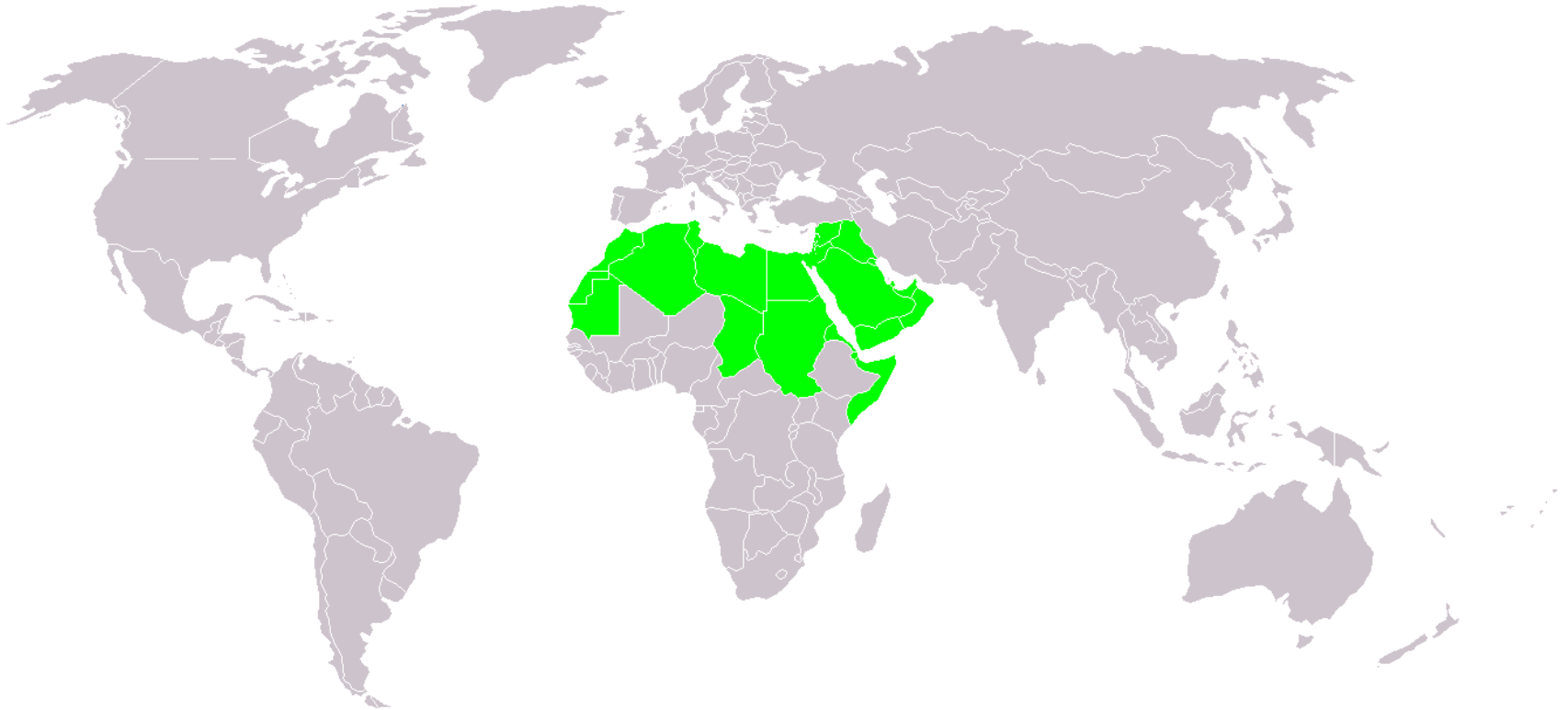

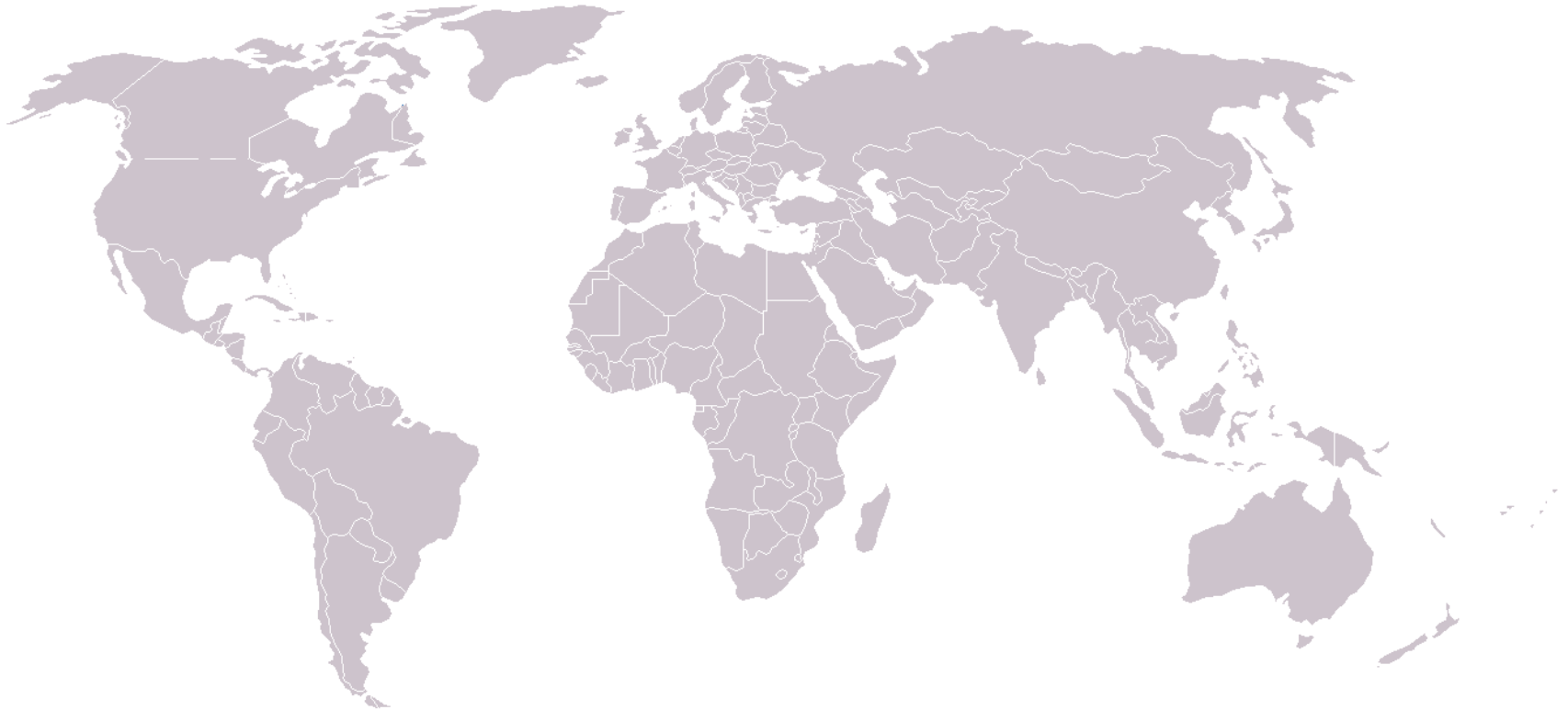

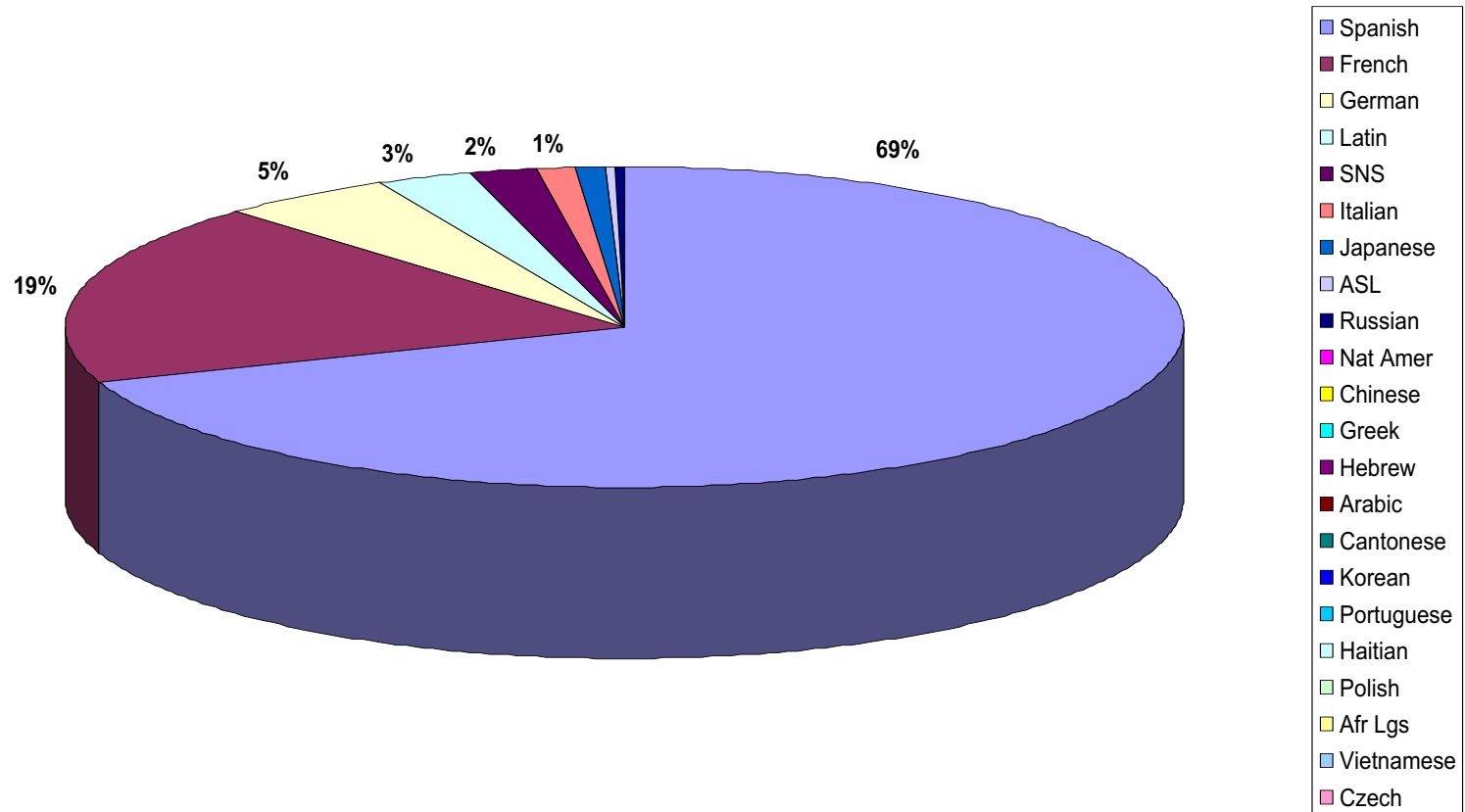

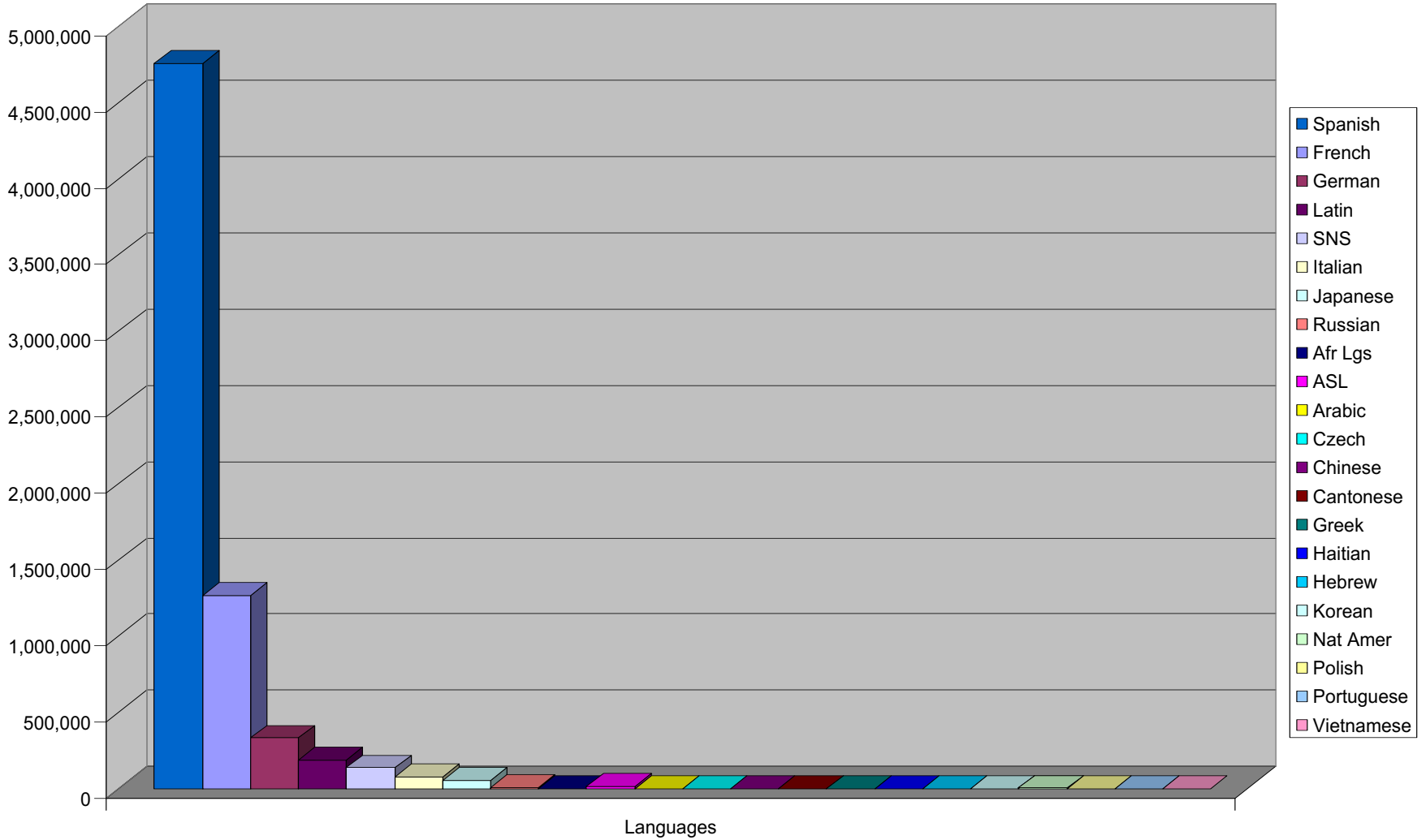

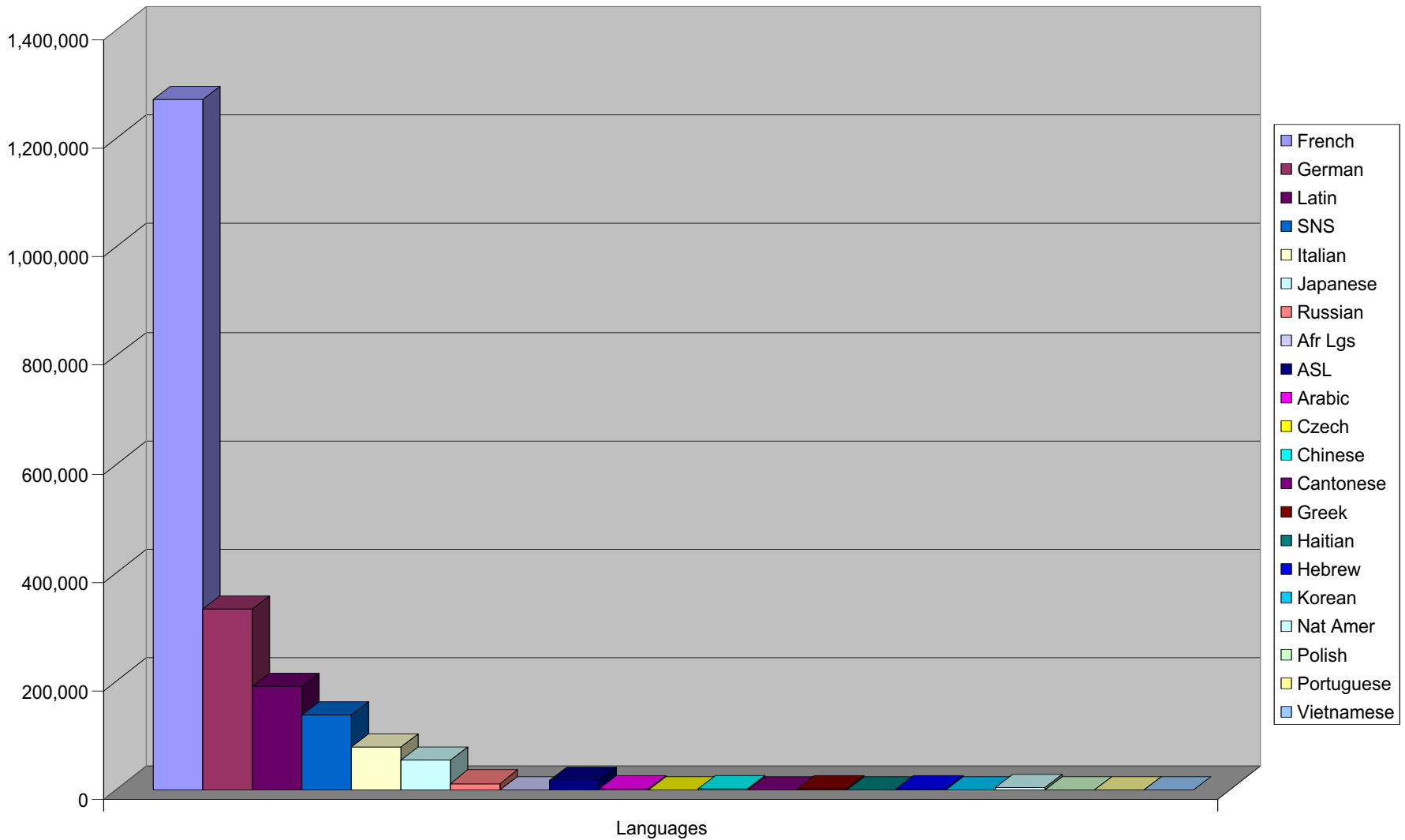
Languages studied in US 2000



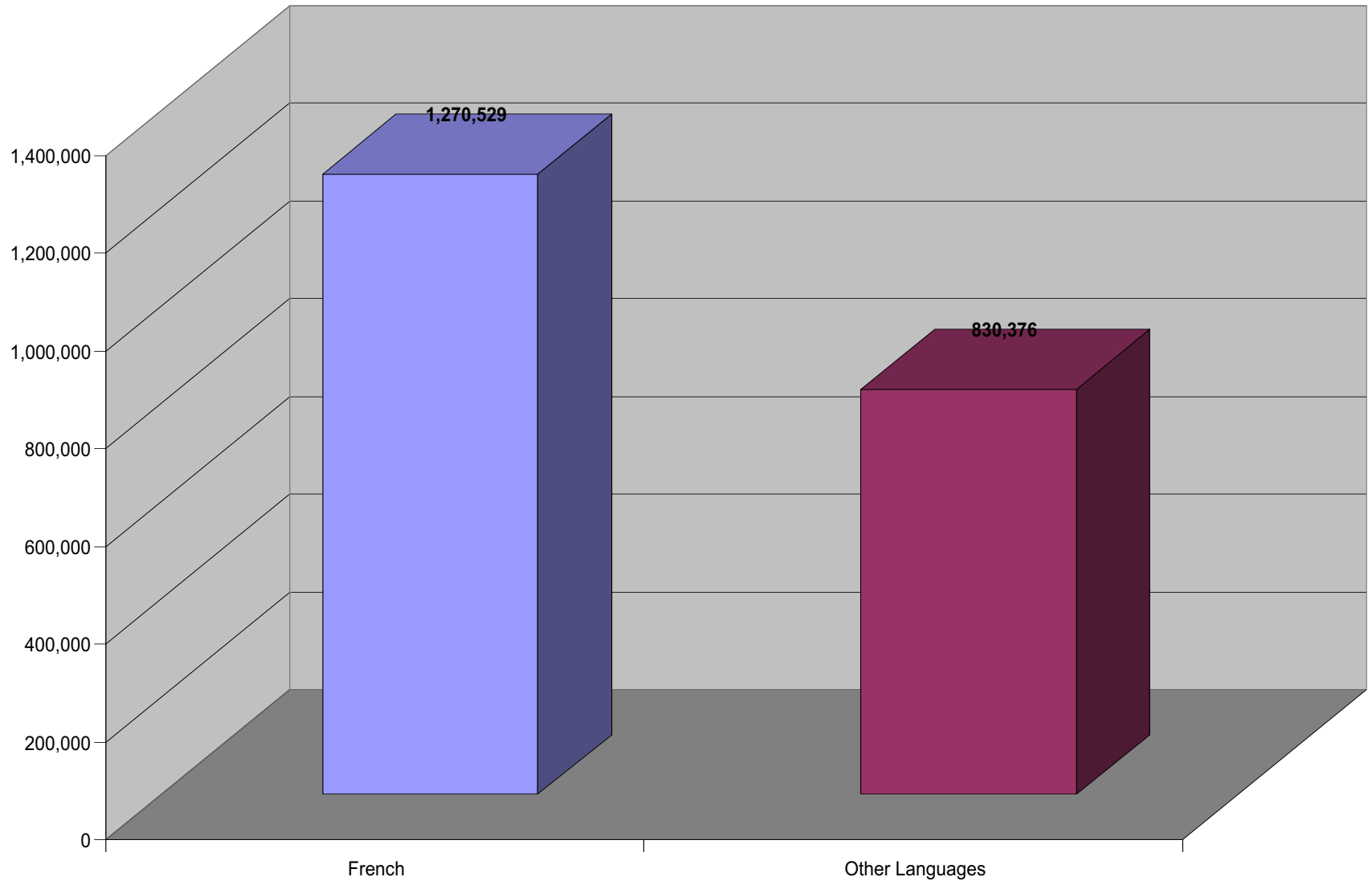
Languages studied in US- 2000



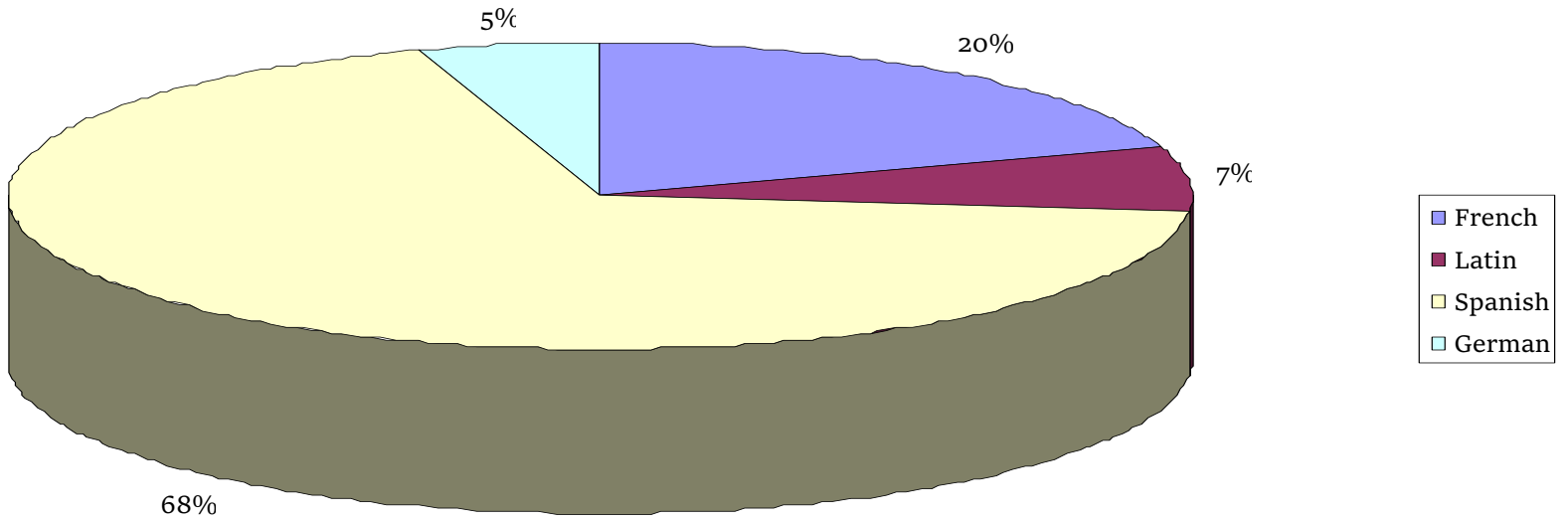
Languages studied in US except Spanish- 2000



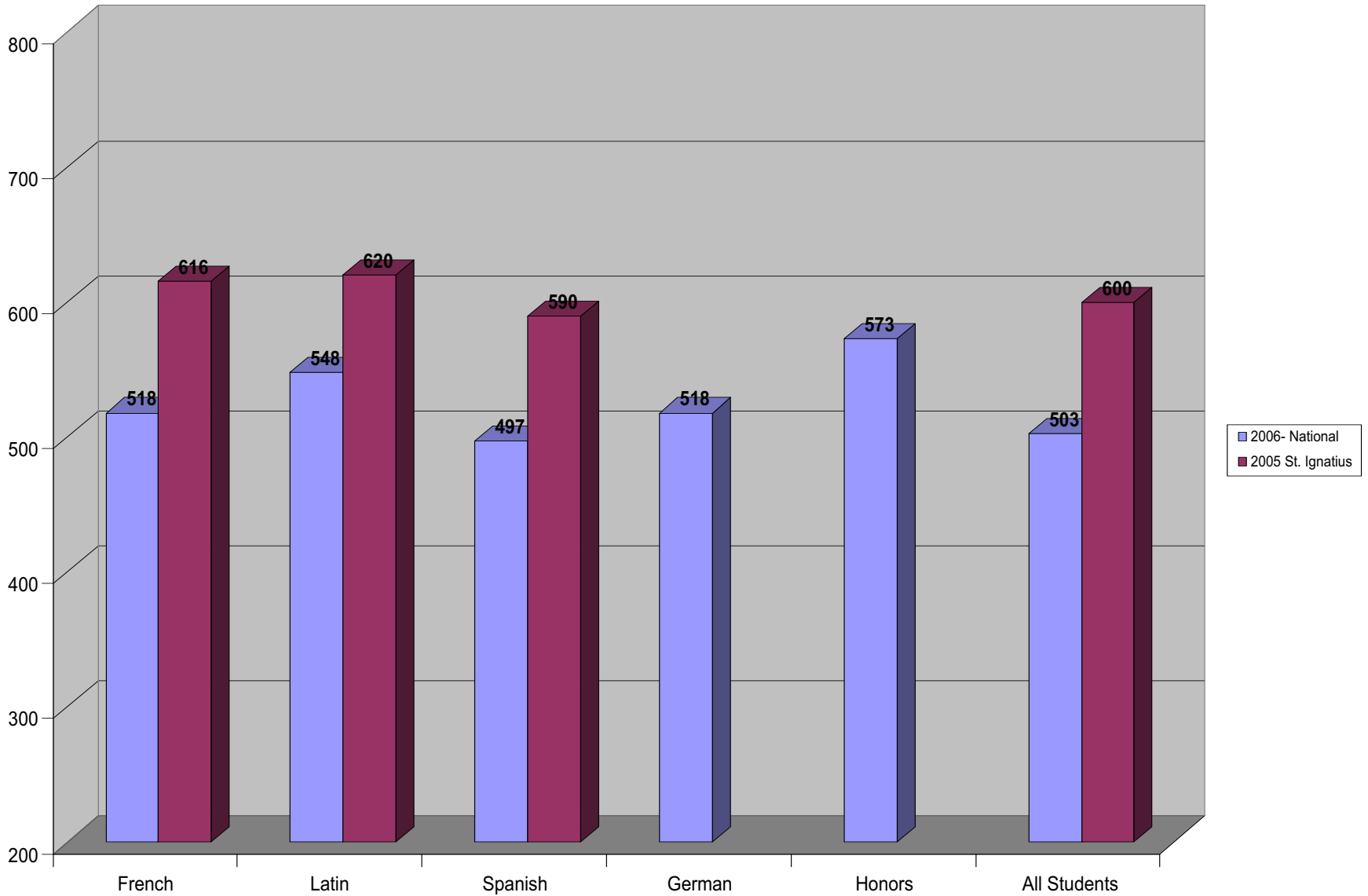
French and all languages except Spanish- 2000



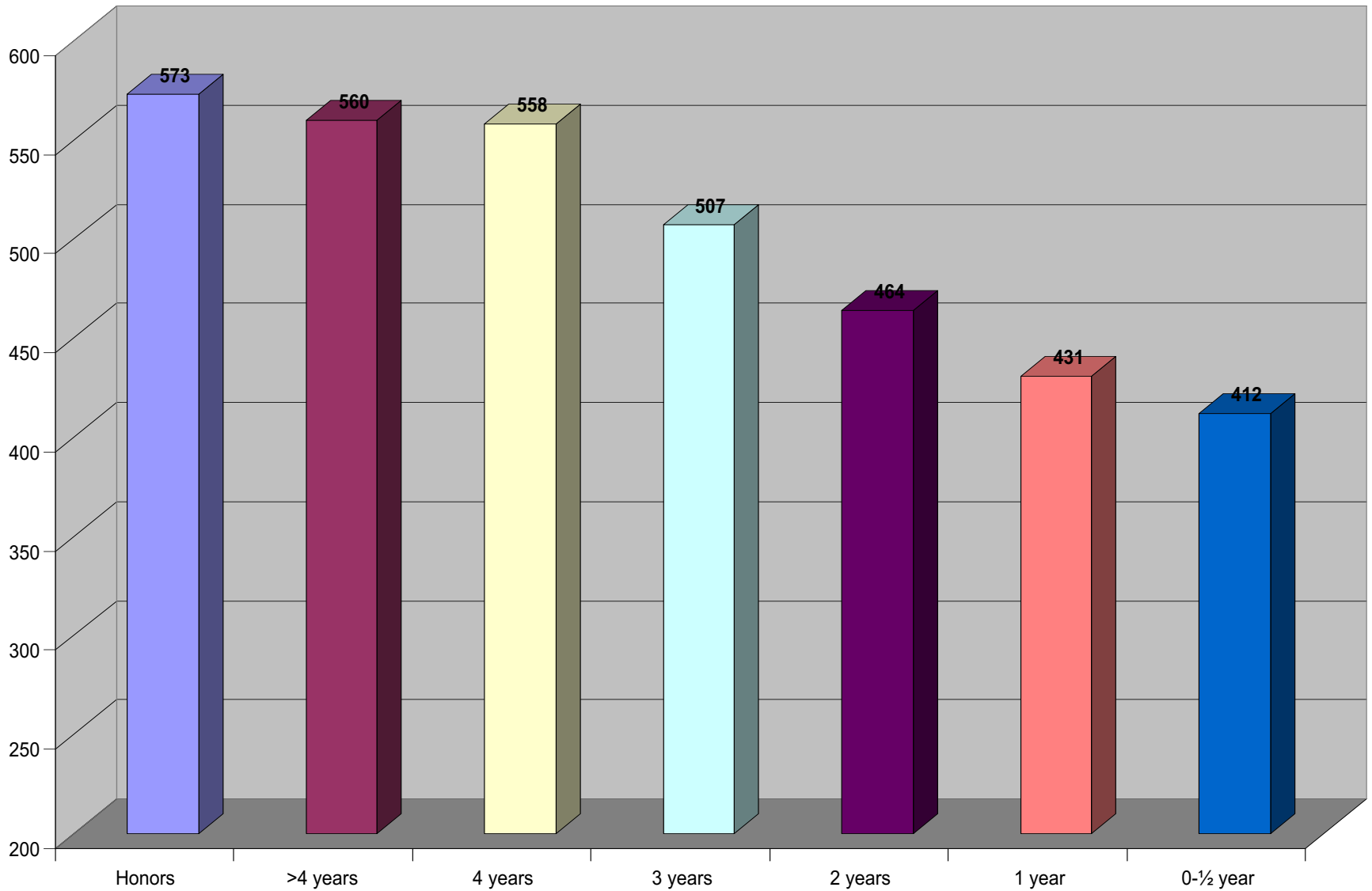
2006 SAT I Students by language

SAT I Verbal Scores- 2006

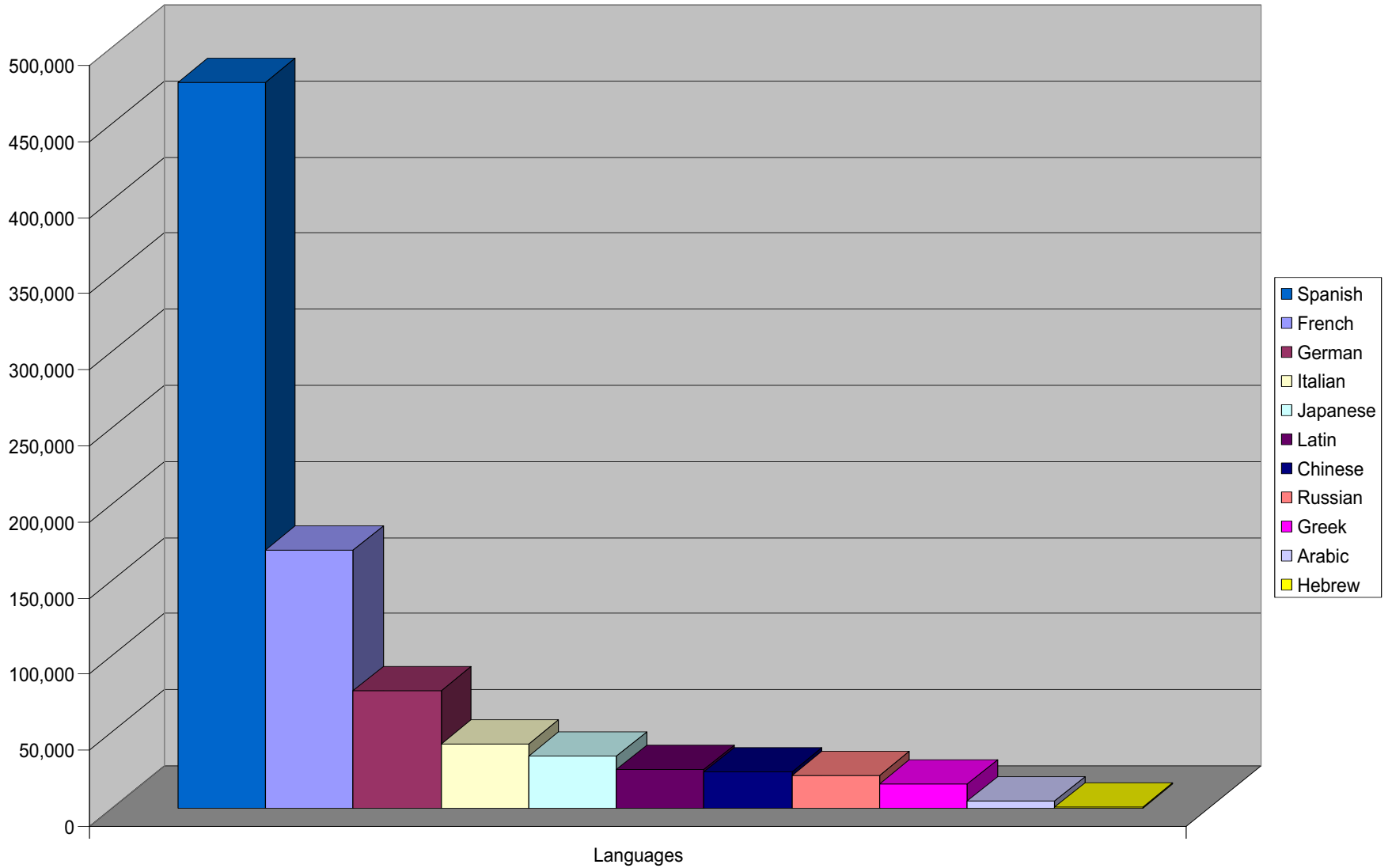

Basilica of Sacre-Coeur

This Church was built by the National Assembly following the defeat in the Franco-Prussian war of 1870. The basilica was consecrated in 1919.
